County ranked 4th in region for crime in 2019

GARNETT — Anderson County ranked 4th in a crime index comparison of six area counties released last week by the Kansas Bureau of Investigation, showing a slight increase in reported crimes from 2018 to 2019.

The annual Kansas Crime Index Report compiled by the KBI measures crime statistics reported to the agency by state and local law enforcement agencies across Kansas.

The six county region of Anderson, Allen, Coffey, Linn, Franklin and Miami counties is a broad mix of rural areas and more suburban populations. But the worst ranking on a per-thousand population basis was won by Allen County.

Allen County, including the cities of Iola, Humboldt, Moran and La Harpe, netted an overall crime index of 26.1 per thousand residents according to the stats

for 2019. The index reflects 321 reported crimes measured by the KBI's analysis, including murder, rape, robbery, and aggravated assault/battery, burglary, theft and motor vehicle theft. Allen County reported seven rapes in 2019, along with two robberies and 41 assaults, 77 burglaries, 172 incidents of theft and 22 stolen vehicles. The county's 271 property crimes in 2019 gave it a 22.0 score per the county's 12,310 population.

By contrast, the most crime-free county in the region was Linn County, population 9,747, with an overall crime index of 13.5 crimes per thousand population. Miami County, population 30,722, was next at 14.3 per thousand. Anderson

County at 7,836 ranked fourth at 15.5 per thousand, Franklin County at 25,538 was next at 18.5.

Crimes compiled in the KBI's categories for Anderson County included one murder, no rapes or robberies, 15 aggravated assaults and 105 property crimes, 36 burglaries and 58 thefts and 11 motor vehicle thefts. The county's total of 121 reportable crimes was slightly ahead of the 118 reported in 2018.

Coffey County's statistics were skewed because the Coffey County Sheriff's department did not submit records for areas outside the local municipalities. The City of Burlington showed an overall crime index of 17.3 per thousand of its 2,543 residents.

Overall the report indicated that violent crime in Kansas increased by 2.6% in 2019. A total of 12,694 violent crimes were reported in Kansas in the categories of murder, rape, robbery, and aggravated

Board President: No special meeting on mask mandate

Petition with 120 signees won't get board attention until September meeting

GARNETT — A petition signed by local residents and parents opposing a face mask requirement for USD 365 students and staff when they head back to class later this week has been submitted to school board members, but it likely won't be considered by the school board until the regular meeting early next month.

Board president Gaylene

Comfort told the Review yesterday she had received the documents, but that she would not call a special meeting of the board to consider it. She said the earliest opportunity board members would have to review the signatures and the policy would be September 3.

Petition organizer Mark Powls of Garnett said petitions with some 120 signatures had been emailed to most board members last week. He

said the signatures reflected just a few days of collection, and were primarily solicited by signors coming to the homes of petition carriers to sign.

"If we were to take this door-to-door I guarantee the count would reach much higher numbers in favor of removing mask and social distancing mandates in our district," Powls said.

The board doesn't meet in regular session until September

Powls, a former educator and the husband of an Anderson County High School music teacher, said the petition sought to convince USD

Some COVID-19 assistance funds still available to help businesses in Garnett

GARNETT — Local businesses have stepped up to ask for help from a federal funding pool of \$126,000 each granted to Anderson County and the City of Garnett to assist with COVID-19 hardships, and some city funds are still available for businesses that apply.

Both entities were awarded \$132,000 in Community Development Block Grant - Corona Virus (CDBG-CV) funds by Governor Laura Kelly on June 2, 2020. A portion of those funds

were paid to the Southeast Kansas Regional Planning Commission to administer the grant. Anderson County and Garnett contracted with Southeast Kansas Regional Planning Commission to assist with administering the funds. Each entity had \$126,000 to grant to businesses in Garnett and Anderson County. The county's funds have been fully allotted, but city community development director Susan Wettstein said the city still had some funds available.

These grant funds are to assist small businesses who employ persons from low to medium income households.

"To date, we have had nine (9) qualifying businesses apply for the grant," Wettstein said. "Five of those businesses are in the county and four are located in the City of Garnett. The funding for the county at this time has been exhausted, however, the City of Garnett still

County may use 'eye in the sky' to find more things to tax

Aerial service would cost county \$25,000/year for three year agreement

GARNETT — County commissioners are considering a proposal from Anderson County Appraiser Adam Wilson to contract an aerial photography company in hopes of finding hidden or obscured property improvements on local real estate to add to the county tax rolls.

Wilson said Monday the

contract with Eagle View of Bellevue, Wash., would cost \$25,000 per year, but he did not have an estimate on what the net tax revenue gain to the county or other taxing authorities might be. Commissioners said the service would require a three-year commitment. Wilson said he had experience with the company after having used it when he worked for the appraisers office in Montgomery County.

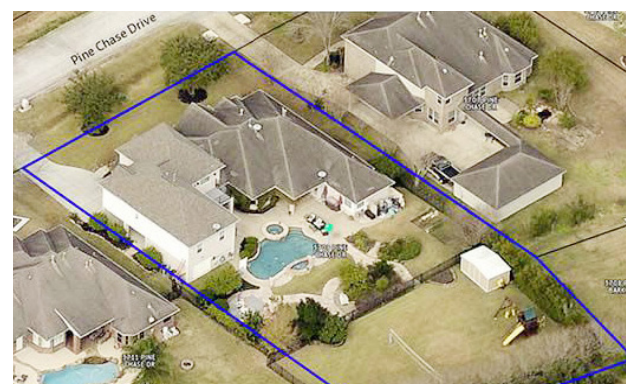
Eagle View uses enhanced photography from circling aircraft to compile multiple view digital photos from various

angles in order to complete a three dimensional image of out buildings and other structures on properties it orbits. That data can then be transcribed by software to give near exact dimensions of buildings including height and size, which are then subject to the county's existing taxing mechanisms.

Wilson said the system was designed to find structures without appraiser's office staff having to go directly onto private properties. He said it was his department's policy not to climb over fences or go through gates in

their search for structures which were supposed to be taxed, but which evaded the county's mill levy because staff didn't know of their existence.

The county's zoning department typically keeps records of new construction projects or additions on properties in the rural areas of Anderson County and those records are available to the appraiser's office for assessment to the tax rolls. That system relies greatly on voluntary compliance with the application pro-

has funds to administer. The grant funds are to be used for working capital such as employee wages, rent, mortgage, and to purchase up to 60 days inventory needed to reopen the business. The following requirements must be met to qualify for the City funds:

- Must be physically located in Garnett city limits.
- Must employ one to fifty employees
- Must have at least 51% full-time equivalent jobs for persons from low to medium income households.
- Must provide financial hardship due to COVID-19
- Must submit the application and all required supporting documentation
- Must disclose if received capital through the alternative sources such as Economic Injury Disaster Loan (EIDL) or Payroll Protection Program (PPP) Loan at the time of application submittal.

ANDERSON COUNTY COMMISSION AUGUST 3, 2020

Chairman Jerry Howarter called the meeting of the Anderson County Commission to order at 9:00 AM on August 3, 2020 at the County Commission Room. Attendance: Jerry Howarter, Present: David Pracht, Present: Leslie McGhee, Present. The pledge of allegiance was recited. Minutes from the previous meetings were approved as presented.

Road & Bridge

Lester Welsh, Road Supervisor, met with the commission. He informed the Commissioners that lines are being painted on Bush City road and then the project will be complete. The total project cost is \$702,752.94 with the County's tax exemption. Discussion was held on the future chip and seal projects. Lester received a quote from Killough Construction to repair Kentucky Rd at 1600 Rd to the reservoir for \$76,308.72. Commissioner McGhee moved and Commissioner Pracht seconded to hire Killough Construction to repair Kentucky Rd to Cedar Valley Reservoir for \$76,308.72. All voted yes. Michelle Miller, Road Secretary, presented a zone change application for Yochem. Commissioner Pracht moved and Commissioner McGhee seconded to approve resolution 20-22 approving zone change application #ZC2020-01 (Yochem) to rezone 5.81 acres from agriculture district to residential estate district. All voted yes.

Register of Deeds

Sandy Baugher, Register of Deeds, met with the commission. She was offered shelving for the deeds books at no charge from Grant County but she must send someone to pick them up. The cost to purchase new shelving is \$7,650 with delivery and install included. She is going to find someone to pick up the shelving so she does not have to purchase the new shelving and will have the Road Department help install when they arrive.

Solid Waste

Scott Garrett, Solid Waste Supervisor, met with the commission. Discussion was held on increasing the cost to dump at the landfill. Prices will increase for all dumping, including the minimum dump fee. Scott does not think the landfill can support a fall free dump week with an increase of traffic from the pipeline project. Discussion was tabled until the following week.

Anderson County EMS

Tanya Ewert, EMS Director, met with the commission. She discussed the new ambulance that was presented the week before. The county would need to pay \$35,245 to cover

the cost that is not included in the Board of Trustees fund that is set aside for ambulances. Commissioner McGhee moved and Commissioner Pracht seconded to pay \$35,245 for a new ambulance out of the Ambulance Reserve fund. All voted yes.

School Districts

Shane Walter, USD 479 Superintendent; USD 479 School Board Member; Don Blome, USD 365 Superintendent, met with the commission. Discussion was held on the Governor's executive order 20-59. Don Blome said that USD 365 already has their reopening guidelines in place and are requiring masks, which is in line with EO 20-59. USD 479 would like a document from the county stating that they are not mandating the school districts to follow EO 20-59. Commissioner Pracht made a motion to not opt out of the Governor's EO 20-59. No second. An Order was drafted by James Campbell, County Counselor, allowing each school district to draft their own reopening plans and not required to follow the Governor's EO 20-59. Commissioner McGhee moved and Commissioner Howarter seconded to approve the Order regarding the school districts reopening plans. Commissioner Pracht voted no. The motion was approved 2-1.

Add, Abatements, Escapes

Adds A20-109 through A20-110, Abatements B20-198 through B20-200, and Escapes E20-126 through E20-127 were approved as presented.

Julie Wettstein, County Clerk, presented a road permit for Centurylink to install fiber optic cable located 1.5 miles south of Garnett at NE Nebraska Road. Commissioner Howarter signed the permit.

Rural Fire

Mick Brinkmeyer, Rural Fire Coordinator, met with the commission. Mick received four bids to survey the land on Westgate in Garnett. He only received one bid from SBB Engineering. They would do the survey, topography, and right of ways for \$3,900. Commissioner Howarter moved and Commissioner McGhee seconded to hire SBB Engineering to

survey the newly purchased land on Westgate in Garnett for \$3,900 to be paid out of the Rural Fire Improvement fund. All voted yes.

County Clerk

Julie Wettstein, County Clerk, presented health insurance renewal information. The County currently has Blue Cross Blue Shield of Kansas. Renewal information showed the best option is to continue with Blue Cross Blue Shield with an increase of 21.22%. Commissioner Howarter moved and Commissioner Pracht seconded to renew the county health insurance with Blue Cross Blue Shield of Kansas. All voted yes.

Keep the right thing first!

Two things that fly directly into every persons life are worry and anxiety. What are the ways to combat these time wasting, irritating and in some instances paralyzing enemies? In Luke 10:38-42 Jesus provides Martha the secret to her anxiety concerning the preparation of a meal for Jesus and the disciples. Jesus and the disciples had stopped at Mary and her sister Martha's house for a visit. Martha immediately began to prepare a meal and almost as quickly worry set in. In 10:40 we read, "But Martha was distracted by all the preparations that had to be made. She came to Jesus and asked, 'Lord don't you care that my sister has left me to do the work by myself? Tell her to help me!'" Jesus then tells her, "Martha, Martha, the Lord answered, you are worried and upset about many things, but only one thing is needed. Mary has chosen what is better, and it will not be taken away from her." In other words Martha keep the right thing first.

In Luke 22 we read of the anxiety that the crowd, chief priests and teachers of the law created for Pilate. Pilate became frustrated when he could find no reason for putting Jesus to death, but the crowd clamored for his execution. Pilate went so far as to speak to the crowd three times but he could find no way to both save himself from embarrassment and Jesus from death so he turned Jesus over to them. This is typical of the situation the non-christian will find themselves in, being manipulated and determined by the world with no really good alternative for solving the crisis. The result is anxiety.

WEEKLY DEVOTIONAL

Our conscience will tell us when we are doing something outside of God's will. The question then becomes will we listen or is our conscience so seared from overindulgence in ourselves and the world that it only bothers us for a moment then it is forgotten. Trouble is someday we will come up against a decision like the one Pilate made and our very eternal existence will hinge on the correct decision, not the one we may desire or the one that is popular with the crowd.

There is nothing quite so sad as to come to the end of your life thinking you are in total control only to find out you have been manipulated and determined by the world. In Philippians 4:6-7 the Apostle Paul provides Timothy with some sound advice concerning anxiety. "Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. 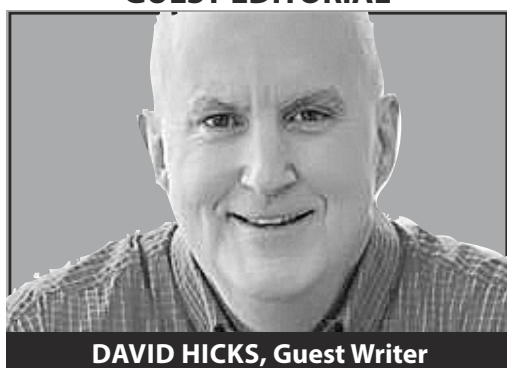

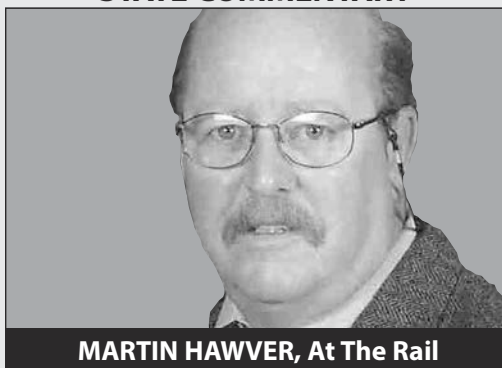

For Kansans, that national ticket for both parties will undoubtedly trickle down to votes for Kansas House and Senate candidates... and later this week we ought to know just who those legislative candidates are going to be after the state canvass board checks and rechecks votes from border to border to see who will be on the November ballot. That's

not all settled yet, but soon we ought to know who survived that handful of close legislative primary elections.

And there's going to be more politics springing up when we learn just where the counties have spent about \$400 million in federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act money that the state's Strengthening People and Revitalizing Kansas (SPARK) Task Force has handed them. Look for every dime to be examined not only for recovery benefits, but to see just what groups got the federal money—and their political leanings if they can be discerned.

Oh, yes, and there's the reopening of schools in many districts and colleges and universities and whether they trigger a new increase in COVID-19 cases which will ripple from the schoolhouses and campuses into the state as a whole, with the now predictable economic damage to the economy—and yes, again—state revenues.

Lots of low-key activity that might grow to become major import to the state and the remaining two years of Gov. Laura Kelly's term as governor and the tilt of the Legislature next session.

The national political conventions? Essentially a diversion for most Kansans, who already know who gets their vote. But in a strong Republican state, that pandemic and

Remembering the horror of the Indianapolis

This summer marks the 75th anniversary of the worst disaster in the history of the United States Navy - the sinking of the USS Indianapolis.

Three hundred men died in the initial catastrophe on July 30, 1945, then the survivors cast into the sea suffered unimaginable horrors, abandoned for days without food or water in shark-infested waters.

As long as tales of the sea move human hearts, the story of the Indianapolis will shock and inspire.

She was a heavy cruiser, in between a larger battleship and smaller destroyer. Sleek, fast and elegant, she bristled with firepower - her 8-inch guns could fire a 250-pound shell 18 miles. Franklin Roosevelt made her his ship of state, and she became the flagship of the Navy's 5th Fleet.

During World War II, she saw significant action and suffered a debilitating kamikaze strike at Okinawa. Quickly repaired, she embarked on a secret mission to deliver components of the atom bomb dropped on Hiroshima. She then proceeded unaccompanied to Leyte in the Philippines.

A Japanese submarine stumbled upon her on a dark night. It fired six torpedoes, two of which struck the ship in quick succession right after midnight. The ship sank in 12 horrifying minutes.

Nine hundred men made it off, suddenly in the middle of the Philippine Sea at night with their home, their weapon, their mistress

gone. Only about half had a life jacket or life vest. They were spread over miles. Many were wounded.

At first, they were hopeful about a rescue that didn't come for four excruciating days. The ship's SOS call was picked up at three places, but the message was ignored. A failure in the Navy's tracking system meant no one noticed when the Indianapolis didn't show up at Leyte. Day by day, hundreds more men died.

During the day, the sun tortured them. The salt water weakened them. Thirst agonized them. Their life jackets began to give out.

They died of exposure and exhaustion. They died from the nightmarish attacks of circling sharks. They died from the terrible

temptation of drinking salt water. They died from madness. They died from sheer despair, giving up and sinking beneath the waves.

Still, somehow, at the extreme edge of human endurance, 317 men survived when a plane on a surveillance mission finally came across them.

For Capt. Charles McVay, a new agony began. As the Indianapolis sank, he had considered going down with the ship before getting swept away by a wave. At first separated from his men, he had the horrifying thought that he alone might have survived.

The Navy court-martialed him for not having zigzagged to evade attack, even though his orders only made it mandatory during the day, even though the maneuver was of dubious effectiveness, even though the captain of the Japanese sub said he assuredly would have sunk the Indianapolis anyway.

There was a much stronger case that McVay had been let down by the Navy, since he wasn't apprised of reports of Japanese subs operating in his vicinity and the Navy, shockingly, lost track of his ship. Yet McVay was found guilty. A broken man, he took his own life in 1968, and the Navy didn't expunge his record of wrongdoing until 2001.

It's another tragedy associated with a ship whose drama, heartbreaking and astonishing, will never leave us.

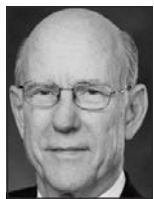

Bottles are often a part of excavation

One neat thing is if you are doing archaeological work around an early historical site, chances are you might find some early bottles.

That's exactly what I've been doing at my latest site. For this weeks column I want to share with you three of these finds.

I have very little history of the first bottle (bottom right, on top). It is an early medicine bottle. Embossing was popular before paper labels came along.

Kansas high school fall sports are a go says KSHSAA....for now

GARNETT - With the cancellation of last year's state basketball tournament on March 12th and consequently the spring sports last season at high school's across Kansas, very little has been answered 6 months later as the KSHSAA announced July 28th that high school sports were good to go, but individual school districts retain the right to modify the start dates for practice or competition on their local and county health recommendations.

Despite dominoes falling across the country and sports being canceled or postponed throughout the college and high school landscape, locally, Anderson County High School has been hard at work this summer with weight programs and the various skills and running workouts in preparation for what they hope will be 2020 fall sports.

Now that school starts this week, teams are preparing for what will be without a doubt the most unique sports season anyone has had to navigate.

Anderson County Bulldog head football coach Logan Pegram knows that it will be controversial regardless of the decision that the KSHSAA made.

Pegram said, "I feel that KSHSAA made a very tough

decision that was reactionary of the 5-5 decision of the Kansas State Board of Education. I also think that when the decision was made to go back to school at the normal start date that it also made sense to start athletic competition at the normal time. Many of our athletes have been competing in baseball, softball, basketball, and football combines across the state. Today, more than ever we are living in an imperfect world in regards to COVID-19 no matter what we do it will be wrong in the eyes of many."

When speaking with local coaches, they have been doing their part to make sure their athletes will stay healthy and ready to compete.

Head cross country coach Mike Sibley said throughout the summer they tracked everyone at each practice for contact tracing and practiced social distancing and wore masks before and after runs.

"I take the temperature of everyone who shows up," Sibley said. "The athletes have been asked to not show up if they do not feel well or have been in contact with anyone who is sick."

Coach Sibley added, "We no longer allow partner running either so that athletes won't run within 6 feet of each other."

With practice starting yesterday, Sibley said these practices will continue to be in

effect.

Coach Pegram is doing all they can to keep his kids healthy as well, "Precautions - Since late June we have been wearing masks in the weight room. We have tried to be socially distanced for outside workouts as well. Looking ahead to the fall season and practice. We have ordered splash shields for helmets, will limit contact at practice, and try to sanitize equipment during breaks and after every practice."

Pegram added, "I don't know what the fall will look like. I do know that as a society we have made decisions from the top down that we are going to attempt to live with the threat of the virus. I also know that kids need school and social interaction with their peers. My goal is to do that as safely as possible until we are directed differently. I hope that our community can rally around our students, teachers, and athletes. In a world that has become so divisive I would love to see Anderson County rally together."

Coach Sibley echoed those safety measures, "To be honest, my high school athletes do a great job of doing what they are asked to do. They know that the consequence is losing the sport that they love; so they follow the rules to minimize risk. My biggest fear is not practice or the ability

to keep kids safe there - it is what precautions that we will be able to implement for competition when adults, who may or may not agree with or follow our school's safety policies are suddenly involved in the equation."

The KSHSAA has made suggestions regarding competition, fans and how to safely conduct those events but are leaving everything up to the host schools at this time.

Sibley stated if he had any complaints about how the situation has been handled at this point, it would just be nice to have a uniform set of safety rules so that it is clear that all schools are taking the necessary precautions.

"My only complaint about the current situation is that I personally believe that a universal mandate for safety would be more effective than allowing local control in this instance. I believe that kids need sports, they need safety and they operate best when the same rules are applied across the spectrum. They do not do as well when different rules apply to different people and in different circumstances."

First and foremost though is the health of the athletes and their coaches.

"I promise that we will put the safety of our cross country runners ahead of everything else," Sibley concluded.

assault and battery. The violent crime rate is currently 17.3% above the 10-year average.

In 2019, aggravated assaults and batteries increased by 6.1%, which drove the violent crime rate up. Yet, fortunately, the state saw a decline in the number of murders, rapes, and robberies. Across Kansas 130 murders, 1,297 rapes, and 1,422 robberies were reported.

Total property crime offenses in Kansas declined by 6.8%. Even motor vehicle theft, which has been on the rise for several years, declined statewide in 2019.

Data from the Kansas Crime Index report is derived from standard offense and arrest reports submitted to the Kansas Incident Based Reporting System (KIBRS) by local law enforcement agencies across Kansas. It is dependent on victims reporting crimes.

The report is compiled to provide a historical assessment and snapshot of crime trends. The report says it is often not possible to draw further interpretations or conclusions from the data.

The KBI cautions against using data to make direct comparisons between jurisdictions. Often these comparisons are not valid as the factors influencing crime vary widely between communities.

365 board members to call a special meeting to discuss the issue and take a vote to remove the mask and social distancing mandates, but leave the current common sense strategies in place.

"We believe this will bring badly needed normalcy into the lives of our public school teachers, students, and staff but allow for good hygiene practice, temperature checks before entering our buildings and sending students and teachers home when sick and

isolating potentially infected areas to be bleached before reentry," Powls said. He said the effectiveness of masks is widely debated, and that some people would be infected with or without a mask mandate. He said other methods existed for handling the COVID-19 threat "without destroying another year of school."

The mask requirement is part of USD 365's school reopening plan, but has become more controversial after board members in Crest USD 479 opted to conduct its fall reopening without a requirement for teachers

and students to wear masks. Districts have that option because Anderson County Commissioners opted out of Governor Laura Kelly's statewide mask mandate in early July.

Powls said a number of district staff and teachers had expressed support for the removal of the mask mandate in USD 365, but that they feared criticism or repercussions from school administration if they spoke publicly.

process. Some projects are conducted without applying for a permit, which means tax assessors never get a heads up that they exist.

The project might also have law enforcement applications and might have some value to the City of Garnett, but Wilson said he had not yet discussed the service or possible cost share options for the contract with Anderson County Sheriff Vern Valentine or with the City of Garnett.

Commissioners had not approved the contract as of Monday's commission meeting. Wilson said if approved this year the system would most likely be deployed later this fall after the leaves are off the trees in the area.

Hummingbirds - Small bird, big thrills

They may be small and tough to spot, but backyard hummingbirds sure seem to cause a big stir.

"I've been a bird watcher since I was four years old, so I've been doing this for a long time," said Chuck Otte, a K-State Research and Extension agriculture and natural resources agent in Geary County. "But in the last 20 years, there has been an explosion of interest in hummingbirds."

Folks in Kansas and much of the Midwest likely have several more weeks to enjoy the petite birds, which weigh as little as 3.2 grams - or somewhere

between the weight of a penny and a nickel.

"The real action started in mid-summer, around July 15," said Otte, the featured speaker Aug. 12 during the K-State Garden Hour, an online program hosted each week by K-State Research and Extension.

In Kansas, "99.99 percent" of hummingbirds in the eastern half of the state are Ruby-throated hummingbirds, according to Otte. West of Wichita and Salina, he said there are fewer Ruby-throated birds and more of such western species as Rufous, Broad-tailed, Calliope and Black-chinned.

An avid birder, Otte said hummingbird activity is likely to continue in Kansas through the end of August, when the parents and their offspring begin migrating to southern parts of Mexico and Central America.

But while the fun lasts, Otte said backyard enthusiasts in Kansas can encourage hummingbird sightings by following a few simple guidelines:

- Place feeders where they are easily seen and reached for cleaning and filling. In general, feeders that are in an open area with plenty of sun have more activity.

- Change nectar every two to three days; every day if it's hot and sunny.

- Fill feeders two-thirds full. If birds drink that amount quickly, fill a little higher the next time.

- Make sure you've got red on the feeder and in the landscape.

"You do not need red dye in the water; in fact, dyes may be detrimental," Otte said, noting that the concentration in most red dyes on the market exceeds the recommended daily limit of red dye #40 for humans.

"The color red is a flashing neon sign for hummingbirds," Otte said. "Put on a red shirt or a red hat and sit out on your deck, then see how long it takes for one to come check you out. On feeders, a small amount of

red color is all you need."

When making nectar for the feeder, he suggests a mixture of four parts water to one part sugar, which does not need to be boiled. The feeder should be cleaned with a weak bleach solution each time you add nectar. "Do not use honey or artificial sweeteners," he said; honey may cause an infection and sweeteners have no food value to hummingbirds.

"One 8-ounce feeder will fulfill the daily energy needs of 40 to 60 hummingbirds. More feeders will allow them to feed more easily with less stress. You can also use more feeders to defeat territoriality among the birds."

Otte's go-to source for learning more about hummingbirds is the publication, *Hummingbirds of North America*, in the Peterson Field Guide series.

His full Aug. 12 presentation, which includes more ideas for attracting hummingbirds, is available online from the K-State Department of Horticulture and Natural Resources.
