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## Emerson claims judge had 'personal relationship'

**Defense says search warrant was compromised by judge's prior knowledge**

GARNETT – An August 25th hearing has been set in Anderson County District Court to determine whether a search warrant signed by a local magistrate judge should be invalidated, due to the defendant's assertion that the judge had a relationship with both the defendant and an informant in the case prior to the search.

Prosecutors, however, say the defense has provided no facts in their recent motion to back up that asser-

tion. Defense attorney Jess Hoeme said any evidence supporting the 13 felony counts against his client Tommy Emerson gained by the warrant have to be thrown out, because District Magistrate Judge Kevin Kimball knew those involved in advance of the search and knew about the sex and drug activities investigators claim were underway at the residence.

Emerson, 57 of Garnett, is charged with multiple felonies involving drug distribution, possession and distribu-

tion of narcotics and repeatedly using a state and federally-regulated cell phone to arrange drug deals in connection with a meth-for-sex "flophouse" at his former residence on West Second Avenue in Garnett. Emerson told investigators he frequently procured methamphetamine and offered the drug to guests at his home in order to intensify their sexual encounters. Emerson denied ever having sold the drug to any of his guests or to others.

In his motion to suppress, Hoeme said Judge Kimball should have excluded himself from the process because of his prior involvement, and by not doing so the search violated Emerson's Fourth Amendment Rights against illegal search and seizure – primarily by not having a detached,

neutral party review the investigators' reasoning for conducting the search.

"The defendant asserts that the magistrate who reviewed the affidavit and signed the search warrant for his home on February 6, 2020, was neither detached nor neutral," Hoeme's motion reads. "The magistrate judge who signed the search warrant for Emerson's home has a past personal relationship with Emerson as well as the informant, and the magistrate is also personally familiar with the location and activities alleged to have occurred at the home sought to be searched."

But a state attorney general's office assistant helping prosecute the local case argued in a response that no

such suppression of evidence can be affected until that facts of Emerson's allegation are considered – and his lawyer's motion doesn't include any of those alleged facts. State law clearly required those facts to be presented, Stephen Maxwell said.

"The defendant's conclusory and vague statements about the magistrate having 'a past personal relationship with Emerson as well as the informant and the magistrate is also personally familiar with the location and activities' does not contain the specificity necessary to conclude, even if true, that the magistrate abandoned his role as a neutral and detached magistrate," said the response from

## Kincaid Fair seeks ideas, helpers to replace event's legacy carnival

**Carnival played Kincaid Fair each year since 1963, but was no match for 2020s public event shutdowns**

KINCAID – Area residents were brainstorming last week for new ideas after Kincaid Fair Association officials announced there would be no midway carnival at this year's Kincaid Fair set for September 23-25.

A notice posted to the KFA's website said a tentative carnival scheduled to appear wouldn't be booked for 2021, following a blight that's hit small town fairs and events throughout the 2021 fair season after the Covid shutdowns killed a number of the businesses throughout the country last year. The carnival scheduled at the Anderson County Fair a few weeks ago also cancelled on late notice due to a labor shortage.

KFA board member Gary Holloway said the price tag of the tentatively scheduled replacement for then now defunct Toby's Carnival – which had booked the Kincaid Fair since 1963 – ended up being more than the fair association thought they could cover.

"Unfortunately there is a shortage of carnival companies in the Midwest," a notice on the KFA's website said. "This makes it nearly impossible for small fairs such as the Kincaid Fair to afford contracting a carnival when pre-sale of tickets require as much as \$25,000-\$30,000."

Fair organizers were encouraging the public to come up with ideas for fun events to add to the fair – and just as importantly to volunteer to help man them or otherwise see them through. Replies to the notice on the Facebook page suggested ideas like a movie night, street dance, horse shoe and corn hole tournaments, kids tractor pull and Bingo, among others. Holloway said the fair board was in need of volunteers to help run those replacement games and events as well.

"The world is full of ideas," Holloway said. "But you have to be able to implement them." Holloway also said the fair association was hoping the area schools would allow their high school bands to take part in the parade. One of the largest fair parades in the area, the Kincaid Fair has been a staple for numerous area marching bands for years.

Daniel Yarnell with the former Toby's Carnival told the Review on Sunday the Covid shutdowns of 2020 killed his carnival and also closed a sister operation run by his mother. Yarnell is a 4th generation carnival operator and 3rd generation owner. The Kincaid Fair was the first show his grandfather booked as a new owner in 1963, and though the operation quickly outgrew the Kincaid event, Yarnell said Toby's kept it on the schedule out of loyalty and gratitude for more than 50 years.

"There was no stimulus for our industry to start with in terms of PPP and all that stuff," Yarnell said of the carnival industry's plight. "Shuddered venue grants didn't help us because we didn't have a permanent box office

## County fair wraps up 2021 with final demo derby event

GARNETT – The Anderson County Fair caps off this coming Saturday night with the Fall Demo Derby at the fairgrounds arena and a \$7,500 night's purse for smash-em-up drivers from around the area.

The Saturday night event starts at 7:00 p.m., gates open at 5:30 p.m.

It's the first year the fair association has sponsored two demo derbies in the same summer season. Fair board member Jess Rockers said the opportunity presented itself and board members were anxious to generate some extra dollars after a fair week that was unseasonably hot – even for a Kansas summer – and saw the cancellation of the carnival due to a labor shortage in the company.

"This one's probably a little tougher because every

other county fair has either had one or is having one," Rockers said. Still, demo drivers love their cars and their sport and the public loves to watch, so he said he expected a solid turnout for the event.

Public events like Saturday's derby are seeing large crowds across the

country, and some analysts are of the opinion that's because the public is in the mood for recreation after 2020 Covid lockdowns left most all public events shuttered. Federal Covid relief payments, increased federal unemployment payments

## Garnett starts making payments on "Coldpocalypse" gas loan

**Spiking prices gave city \$2.9 million in extra budget expense**

GARNETT – The City of Garnett has begun paying back money loaned by the State of Kansas to cover spiking costs of natural gas brought on by February's "Coldpocalypse," and those payments along with other expense hikes will force officials to amend the 2021 budget later this year.

Garnett City Clerk Travis Wilson said the city paid its first installment of \$146,826.09 at the end of June on the \$2.9 million the city borrowed from the special state loan

fund. Those payments will be amortized over a 10 year period, Wilson said, and will be made semi-annually on January 1 and July 1.

Governor Kelly and state legislators pushed through the \$100 million emergency loan measure in late February when the legislature was in session, after extreme sub-zero cold slapped Kansas and most of the Midwest and Mountain states beginning about Feb. 10 and lasted for several days. Gas prices over that week-long period exploded, with gas companies claiming restrictions in supply, weather-damaged facilities and frozen windmills that reduced electrical supplies in Texas that resulted in the massive

hike in prices.

City manager Chris Weiner said at the time Garnett's gas prices went from less than \$3 per unit prior to the cold snap to more than \$600 per unit before prices receded. Such hikes led the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission to instigate an investigation into price gouging in late February.

The Kansas loan funds came from state idle funds – money budgeted for state agencies but not yet spent. Those funds are invested and generate some \$50 million annually in extra state revenue. State law prohibits tapping those funds for more than 10 percent of the total – which amounts to about \$3.2 billion.

## Fewer owners owe more in delinquent tax

GARNETT – The amount of delinquent property taxes owed by property owners across Anderson County took a \$20,000 jump this year in comparison to 2020 – in fact notching a higher mark overall than the past several years.

The list of property owners who owe back taxes is required by Kansas law to be published annually for three weeks. The second publication of the 2021 cycle can be seen in today's Review.

According to this year's figures, 430 property owners owed some \$349,000 in delin-

quent tax. Harold DeForest with the Anderson County Treasurer's office said the numbers reflected a drop in the number of delinquent owners this year, probably due to notices sent out that another county tax sale is in

week that the nation had the largest-ever number of available jobs are also combining to increase disposable income, at least in the short term. Rockers said fair organizers had seen that first-hand over fair week, despite the heat and carnival no-show.

"People are spending unreal money," Rockers said. "Tuesday at the Ranch Rodeo we had the best concession sales we've ever had."

Rockers said considering the extreme heat at this year's fair the organization may have actually saved money when the carnival cancelled. The fair association by contract has to pay the difference between actual ticket sales and the carnival's guarantee, Rockers said, and with the heat no doubt reducing traffic the association would have been on the hook for that difference had the carnival performed.

Admission to Saturday's derby is \$10. Kids 10 and under get in free.

- we travel everywhere."

Maxwell.

"The defendant appears to want this court to allow him a hearing after only making general vague allegations not amounting to unlawful conduct," Maxwell said.

Emerson was arraigned on the charges May 17 of this year, more than a year after

the search. Covid-19 delays slowed numerous district court cases as staff worked through various shutdowns, quarantines and moved to remote Zoom hearings and processes.

District Court Judge Eric Godderz will preside over next Wednesday's hearing on the motion.

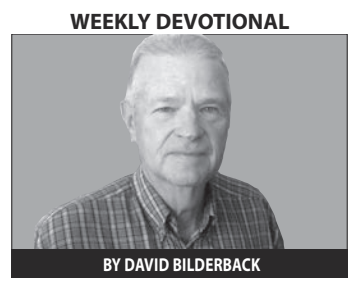

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# Moran, Marshall try to stop another Hunter Biden weekend

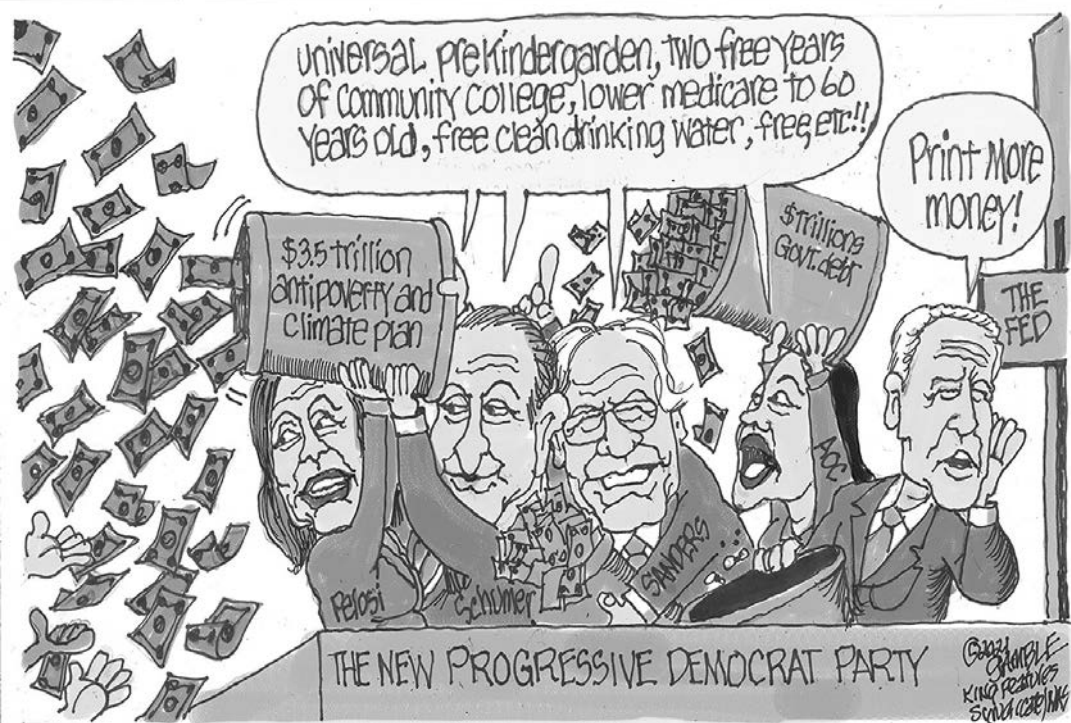

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# Infrastructure bill powered by white racism

The infrastructure bill the Senate passed Tuesday discriminates against white people at every turn.

Americans are enthusiastic about spending money on physical infrastructure - bridges, roads, broadband. But this racist bill hands out jobs and contracts and locates projects based on race, not merit. Minority businesses and neighborhoods hold the inside track. If you're white, you're low-priority.

The bill includes grants to install solar or wind technologies and generate jobs in areas decimated by closing coal mines or coal-fired electric plants. Here's the catch: When contractors bid, the bill says minority-owned businesses will get selected first. Bad news for small-time white contractors in depressed areas.

The same is true for the bill's proposals to improve traffic patterns in cities. Contractors and subcontractors get priority only if they're owned by minorities or women. White male business owners can take a hike.

Americans should be outraged - but not surprised. After all, President Biden's American Rescue Plan Act, passed in March, also put into place an ugly system of discrimination against whites. It offered debt relief to black farmers, but not white farmers. Another provision offered billions in aid to minority-owned and women-owned restaurants, but

told struggling restaurants owners who happened to be white men that they had to go to the back of the line.

The injustice was obvious. White male farmers and restaurant owners sued, claiming the anti-white provisions are unconstitutional. So far, these challengers are winning. In every case, federal judges have halted the race-based programs in the American Rescue Plan Act until the challengers have their day in court. Politico reported last week that Biden's Justice Department may fold without a fight on the black-farmer debt relief cases, because the law isn't on the administration's side.

You would think Democrats and the Biden

White House would get the message. Instead, they're doubling down on rigging legislation and divvying up taxpayer dollars to benefit minorities and shortchange whites.

Chances are high the infrastructure bill's hodgepodge of anti-white discrimination will be struck down by federal courts. In 1989, the Supreme Court ruled that the Equal Protection Clause of the Constitution bars government from trying to even the score by discriminating against whites and in favor of minorities. The justices warned against creating "a patchwork of racial preferences based on statistical generalizations" to correct past injustices. That's precisely what this infrastructure bill does.

The bill's backers would have you believe that obsolete airports, dilapidated public works and deteriorating roads and public spaces are evidence of racial injustice. Rep. Yvette Clarke (D-NY) rails that "our infrastructure is racist" and calls on the Congress to pass a bill that "puts the needs of underserved and disadvantaged communities at the fore."

That's code for minority communities. But the truth is, there are plenty of poor white people in this country, too, and poor, predominantly white communities that could benefit

# A trillion is a trifle in Biden, Bernie Sanders plan

A trillion dollars used to be a lot of money, even in Washington.

Now, a trillion-dollar spending bill is a trifle barely worth arguing over and the stuff of bipartisan consensus.

Oscar Wilde famously said that nothing succeeds like excess, but even he might blanch at the shameless profligacy that is America's new normal.

In their wisdom, Senate Republicans decided to help President Joe Biden pass a portion of his blow-out fiscal agenda, a \$1.2 trillion infrastructure bill that is a prelude to an even bigger, vastly more consequential \$3.5 trillion reconciliation bill.

The infrastructure bill itself is, as fiscal analyst Brian Riedl of the Manhattan Institute notes, "one of the largest non-emergency spending bills of the past 50 years."

Republicans told themselves that only about half, \$550 billion, is new spending, and that by going along they can take the heat off of Democratic moderates Kyrsten Sinema and Joe Manchin, who are being constantly pressured to ditch the filibuster.

Perhaps, but there's no doubt that the GOP has been, and lent a bipartisan imprimatur, to a portion of the president's hoped-for historic spending spree. In so doing, they have taken at least a little ownership of an agenda they should want no part of.

Republicans will have much less influence, and perhaps none, on the next spate of spending, which is the so-called "soft" infrastructure (aka, a wish list of progressive social

programs) after the "hard" infrastructure in the bipartisan bill (roads, bridges, rail).

Under the reconciliation process, tax and spending bills evade the filibuster in the Senate, so Democrats can pass whatever they want so long as they hold all 50 of their senators.

The sheer numbers here are jaw dropping. Including the \$1.9 trillion so-called COVID-19 relief bill from earlier this year, Biden wants to spend nearly \$6 trillion in three measures passed within months of each other. In 2019, by point of comparison, the entire federal budget was \$4.4 trillion (and at the time, President Trump wasn't exactly tightening the country's fiscal belt).

The tide of new spending will add to already extraordinary levels of red ink.

The White House projects that the U.S. debt

will reach 109.7% of GDP this year, higher than at the end of World War II when we had abandoned all fiscal restraint to win an existential struggle against two expansionistic totalitarian empires.

The Senate instructions for the reconciliation bill say that only half of it has to be paid for. Democrats will claim a dog's breakfast of purported savings and painless revenue increases, but the bulk of the new dollars will have to come from a tax increase that easily could rank as one of the biggest ever.

The parameters of the reconciliation bill were crafted by the socialist chairman of the Senate Budget Committee, Bernie Sanders, and it shows.

The priorities read like crib notes from his old presidential campaigns. The bill would add new government programs for the young and the old, from universal pre-K to tuition-free community college, to family and medical leave, to expansions of Obamacare and Medicare.

It would make a big nod to the Green New Deal with a slew of new clean energy initiatives, including "smart agriculture" and "environmental justice," and the creation of a Civilian Climate Corps, a climate-alarmist homage to FDR.

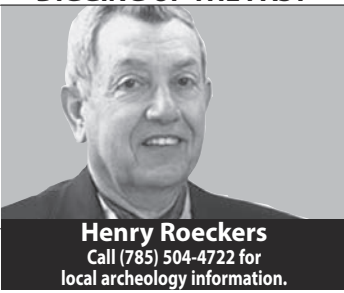

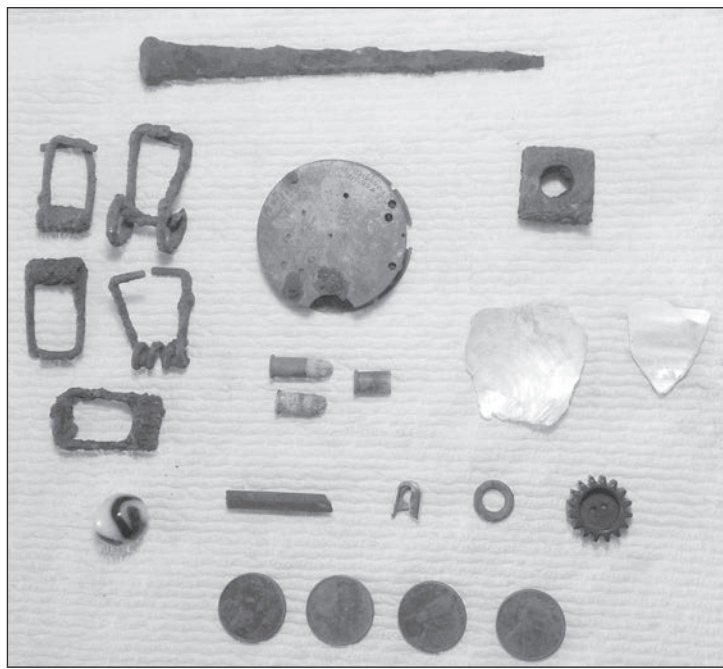

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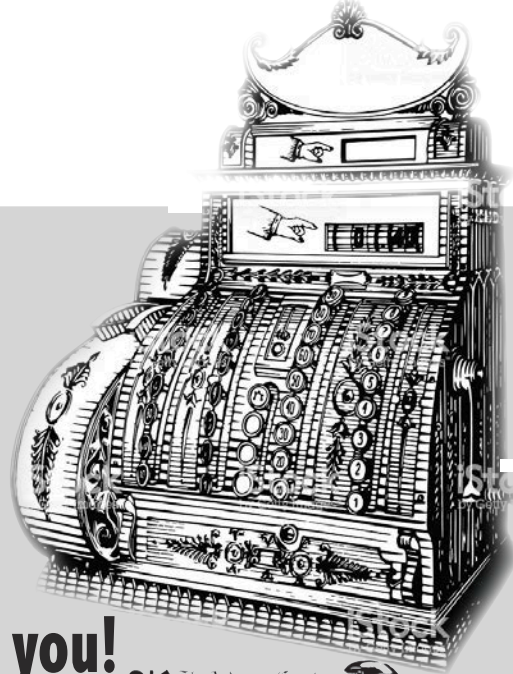

considering only economic need and existing broadband capacity. Because Maine and West Virginia are 94 percent white, they'll get less.

Polls show that Americans favor fixing roads, bridges, tunnels and airports. They know that good infrastructure promotes economic growth. But they've been kept in the dark about the fine print in the bill. Under the guise of upgrading the nation, the bill unfairly treats whites like second-class citizens.

West Virginia has the lowest average income in the nation and ranks 46th in internet connectivity. Maine ranks 36th out of 50 states for income, and 34th in broadband connectivity. People in these states could really benefit from federal broadband assistance. Here's the hitch: The infrastructure bill hits the grant scale in favor of states with high minority and non-English-speaking populations, instead of

## KDHE amends travel quarantine list

TOPEKA - The Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) has amended its travel quarantine list to include the state of Louisiana. No new countries have been added and the countries of Botswana, British Virgin Islands, Cuba, Cyprus, Gibraltar, Jersey and The United Kingdom have been removed.

KDHE has also amended its list to include anyone who attends an in-state or out-of-state mass gathering of 500 or more where individuals do not socially distance and wear a mask should follow the quarantine guidelines. Previously, the list included out-of-state mass gatherings only. These changes are effective today, Aug. 13.

"Given the increased transmission of the Delta variant across the state, we now consider attendance at mass gatherings in state to be high risk situations," Dr. Lee Norman, KDHE Secretary, said. "The virus does not know the boundaries of our state and we must all must take steps to protect those close to us by staying home after attending any large events."

- Traveled on or after Aug. 13 to Louisiana.
- Traveled on or after July 29 to Isle of Man or Martinique.
- Traveled on or after July 15 to Fiji.
- Traveled between July 29 - Aug. 13 to Botswana, Cuba or Gibraltar.
- Traveled between July 15 - Aug. 13 to British Virgin

Islands, Cyprus, Jersey or The United Kingdom.

- Attendance at any out-of-state or in-state mass gatherings of 500 or more where individuals do not socially distance (6 feet) and wear a mask.
- Been on a cruise ship or river cruise on or after March 15, 2020.

The travel quarantine period is seven days with a negative test result or 10 days without testing, with release from quarantine on Day 8 and Day 11, respectively. Further information on quarantine periods can be found on KDHE's website.

For those traveling internationally, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) is requiring testing within three days of flights into the U.S. For further information on this and other requirements, visit their website.

For those who are fully vaccinated (meaning it has been greater than two weeks since they completed their vaccinations) they are not required to quarantine regarding travel if they meet all of the following criteria:

- Are fully vaccinated (i.e., ≥2 weeks following receipt of the second dose in a 2- dose series, or ≥2 weeks following receipt of one dose of a single-dose vaccine).
- Have remained asymptomatic since the travel.

Persons who do not meet the above criteria should continue to follow current quarantine guidance for travel.

Additionally, people with previous COVID-19 disease are not required to quarantine following travel if they meet all of the following criteria:

- Have evidence of a previous infection supported by a positive PCR or antigen test

- Are within 6 months following infection. If an investigation was done documenting the date that symptoms resolved, or the date isolation measures were discontinued for asymptomatic patients, then the 6-month period can start from that end date. If those dates are not available, then the period will start from the date of the positive laboratory test. A serology or antibody test may not be substituted for a laboratory report of a viral diagnostic test.
- Have remained asymptomatic since the travel

Persons who do not meet all three of the above criteria should continue to follow current quarantine guidance for travel.

The travel quarantine list is determined using a formula to evaluate new cases over a two-week period, then adjusted for population size to provide a case rate per 100,000 population. This provides a number that can then be compared to the rate in Kansas. Locations with significantly higher rates -- approximately 3x higher -- are added to the list.

## Additional dose of COVID-19 vaccine now authorized for immunocompromised people

TOPEKA - The Kansas Department of Health and Environment announced that effective immediately Kansas providers may now administer an additional dose of Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna COVID-19 vaccine to individuals who are moderately or severely immunocompromised and have already been fully vaccinated with the Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna vaccines. This follows Thursday's expansion of the emergency use authorization (EUA) by the Food and Drug Administration for these mRNA vaccines, today's recommendation of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) and acceptance by the CDC Director. This EUA does not apply to those who received the Janssen/J&J vaccine as there is currently not enough data to determine if an additional dose of Janssen/J&J vaccine will improve immune response in people who are immunocompromised.

"The data shows us that the vaccine efficacy in some people who are immunocompromised is significantly lower than in people who are not immunocompromised," said Lee Norman, M.D., Secretary of the Kansas Department of Health and Environment. "Additionally, people who are immunocompromised make up to 44% of hospitalized breakthrough cases in the United States. This additional dose may enhance the immunity for those who need extra protection from COVID-19."

This additional dose is recommended for people who are moderately and severely immunocompromised due to a health condition or medical treatment. This includes:

- Active treatment for solid tumor and hematologic malignancies.
- Receipt of solid-organ transplant and taking immunosuppressive therapy.
- Receipt of CAR-T-Cell or hematopoietic stem cell transplant.
- Moderate or severe primary immunodeficiency.
- Advanced or untreated HIV infection.
- Active treatments with high-dose corticosteroids, alkylating agents, antimetabolites, transplant-related immunosuppressive drugs, cancer chemotherapeutic agents classified as severely immunosuppressive, TNF blockers and other biologic agents that are immunosuppressive or immunomodulatory.

KDHE continues to urge people who are immunocompromised, including those who receive an additional dose of mRNA vaccine, to continue to follow prevention measures including:

- Wear a mask
- Stay six feet apart from others they don't live with
- Avoid crowds and poorly ventilated indoor spaces
- Close contacts of immunocompromised people are strongly encouraged to be vaccinated against COVID-19.

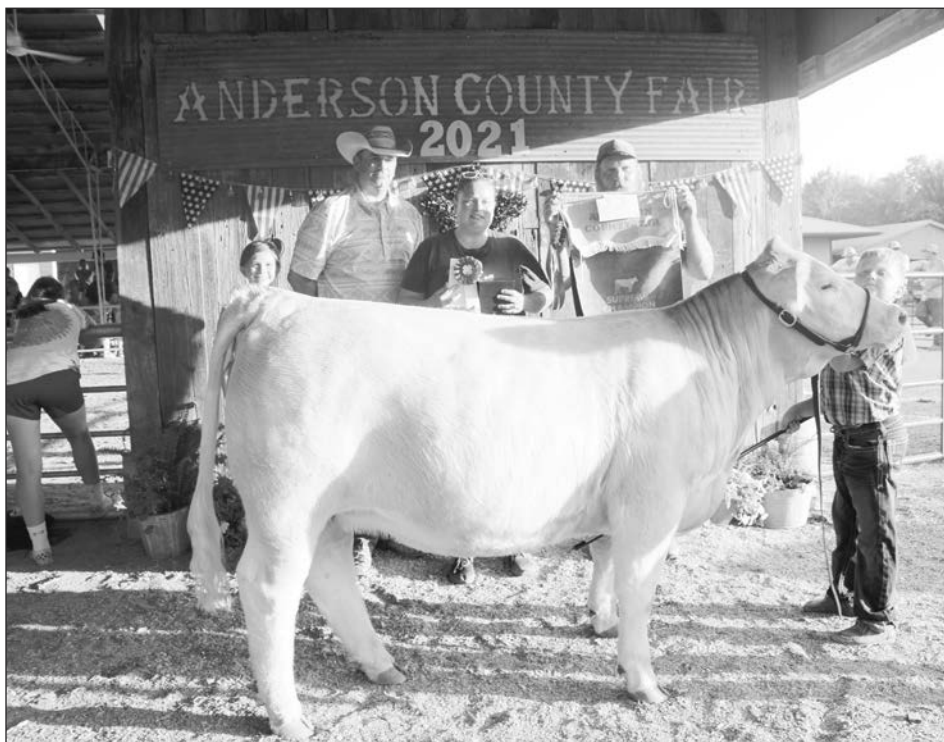

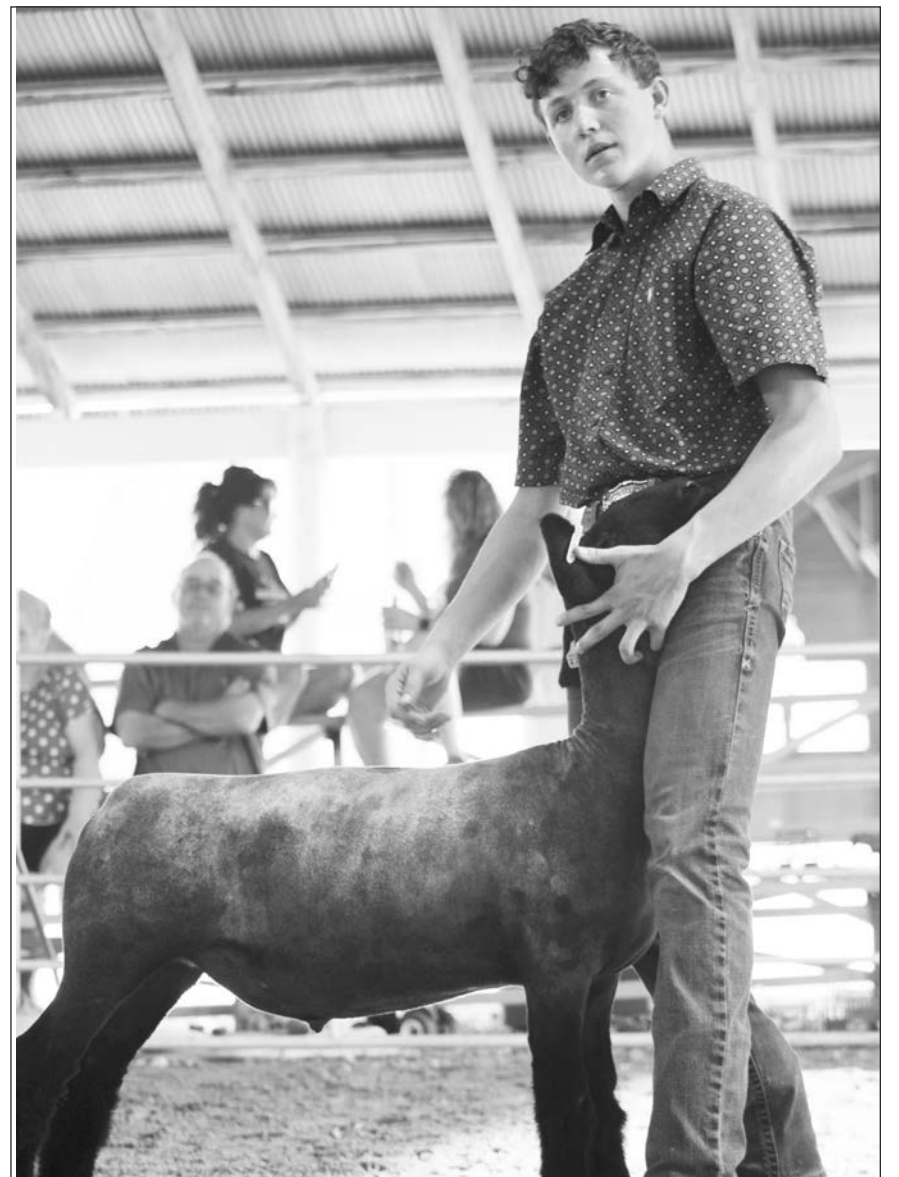
