Tyson holds concession until final tally is known

12th District Senator says reports of her concession were bogus; "you don't concede until the last votes are counted"

PARKER – Contrary to other published reports that said she's conceded the race, Republican candidate for Kansas Treasurer Caryn Tyson said Saturday she's still holding out for totals from the final counties involved in her requested recount.

"I don't think it's going to change it much," Tyson said Saturday. "But you just don't concede until the last votes are counted."

Weeks after the primary vote among Kansas Republicans yielded the narrowest margin of victory for a statewide office in memory, the 12th District State Senator said other media reports that said she'd given up on the recount were in error.

Johnson and Tyson nearly evenly split the state-

"You have an event at school and people really turn out," Linn said. Linn grew up in Cherryvale and

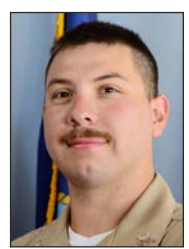

Innocence no defense when KHP seizes car

Patrol releases classic car after spending years trying to have it destroyed

OVERLAND PARK – Richard Martinez will finally get his classic Corvette back – from the Kansas Highway Patrol.

Martinez bought the 1959 Corvette from an Indiana used car dealer in 2016, and when he went to have it inspected, the KHP decided it was "contraband" based on an altered Vehicle Identification Number. The VIN 'alteration' issue is that it had been painted over as much as 40 years before in a previous restoration, something of which Martinez was unaware. Still, KHP seized the vehicle and spent years trying to have the rare, valuable, classic car destroyed.

Even while admitting Martinez had committed no crime. On August 12, 2022, the Honorable James F. Vano of the Johnson County District Court ordered the car returned.

This action follows an amicus brief filed by the Kansas Justice Institute and legislative action to remedy KHP's seizure of an innocent man's dream car. KJI, like the Sentinel, is owned

by Kansas Policy Institute.

The court's order returning the 1959 Corvette cites HB 2595, which allows for classic cars to be registered in Kansas with a proper bill of sale documentation, and SB 267, an appropriations bill containing language to ensure that Mr. Martinez would get his Corvette back. SB 267 also included up to \$20,000 to ensure the value of his vehicle is maintained.

KJI Litigation Director Sam MacRoberts said this is a "major victory."

"The government never should have taken Mr. Martinez's car, to begin with — or spent years trying to destroy it," MacRoberts said. "The government doesn't get to acknowledge someone's innocence but still try to take their property. In the end, though, this is a major victory against government overreach. We're happy Mr. Martinez is going to be able to take a joy ride soon."

KJI's arguments – that the United States and Kansas Constitutions do not permit the government to acknowledge a person's innocence and still take their property – ultimately carried the day in the Legislature. The underlying case is State of Kansas, ex rel. Kansas Highway Patrol v. 1959 Chevrolet

Corvette and is being argued by private counsel. The District Court requested the amicus brief that Kansas Justice Institute filed in August 2021.

Civil asset forfeiture at issue in the case

Partly at issue is a Kansas law that allows — like similar laws in many states — the government to seize assets that are "fruits of criminal activity."

In Martinez's case, KHP inspectors discovered a VIN in a non-public location beneath the car. They used a mirror to access a secret VIN plate, long ago painted over.

KHP then seized Martinez's car under a statute that defines as "contraband" any vehicle with a Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) that has been "destroyed, removed, altered or defaced."

According to MacRoberts, governments sometimes use asset forfeiture to take a person's property without a criminal conviction. And in some cases, like Martinez's, the government never even charged Martinez with a crime.

The laws were intended as a way to clamp down on organized crime

by targeting the assets drug dealers and other criminal organizations purchased with money obtained through illegal activity.

However, as MacRoberts noted in KJT's amicus brief, "civil forfeiture proceedings often enable the government to seize property even when the owner is personally innocent." These laws also make it incredibly difficult for "innocent owners" such as Martinez to recover their property.

As Americans for Prosperity notes: "Owners must prove their property's innocence in court. Unlike criminal trials, where prosecutors must prove a defendant's guilt beyond a reasonable doubt, civil forfeiture proceedings require that the state show the property is connected to criminal activity only by a preponderance of the evidence."

Note, the owner is not the defendant in the civil trial, but rather the property is considered the defendant.

Moreover, in Martinez's case, the government wasn't even asserting that the car was the fruit of any criminal activity — simply that the painted-over VIN plate rendered it "contraband."

The Americans for Prosperity Foundation did an analysis of forfeiture actions in Kansas between July 1, 2019, and Dec. 31, 2021. Their analysis found:

Kansas law enforcement reported seizing \$21.3 million from people in the state.

On average, law enforcement reports taking over \$13,000 per day in money and property from people in Kansas.

KBI annual reports omit up to one-third of the total value of assets forfeited.

Most seizures do not involve amounts that would disrupt organized crime operations.

Owners of seized property have recouped just 8% of the value of their seized assets.

For those few fortunate people who were able to recover their seized property, it took them an average of 419 days to do so.

For most people whose property has been seized by Kansas law enforcement, the cost of recovering their property is greater than the value of the property seized.

"The government should not get to destroy an innocent person's car," MacRoberts said. "When the government knows someone is innocent, they shouldn't use their power and resources to take someone's property."

The bid was from Digital-Ally for \$66,239.75 for installation and 3-year memory for each camera. Commissioner Mersman moved and Commissioner Pracht seconded to purchase 18 cameras from Digital-Ally for \$66,239.75 to be paid out of the jail/sheriff reserve fund. All voted yes.

Rural Fire

Mick Brinkmeyer, Rural Fire Coordinator, and Gabe Pfeffercorn, Pfeffercorn Engineering, met with the commission. He presented 2 bids for the fire station on Westgate Road in Garnett. A bid from Combs Construction, LLC (Bucyrus) was for \$1,781,665 and a bid from Decker Construction (Coffeyville) was for \$2,102,000. The engineer's estimate was for \$1,481,839.49. The Commissioners discussed possibly lowering the cost by removing some specifications on the project. Mr. Pfeffercorn will reach out to the bidders and request additional information on costs. Kelly caught in lie on Kansas jobs

When Kansas Governor Laura Kelly tells her whopper about the recovery of the Kansas economy after she locked the entire state down in 2020 and tried to extend customers' reticence with a paranoia-fostering mask mandate, her words echo around the state's now closed eateries like some in downtown Lawrence.

Ondori Noodle Shop, Wake the Dead Breakfast Bar, the Cosmic Cafe, Bayleaf Indian Restaurant, Aimee's Cafe; others bit the dust too - not just in Lawrence but in towns large and small across the state. It may take decades - if it can ever be summed up at all - to analyze just how much economic damage was done to Kansas by Kelly's lockdown and lockstep Covid policies.

What is known is that on many of the state's downtown streets, businesses that were vibrant beforehand are now gone; their storefronts and their owners financially collapsed, in some cases the owners having left their localities altogether and moved on. Some of those storefronts are still empty or in some cases prospective new tenants used Covid relief funds to start new efforts only to be swamped again by a recession that was as avoidable as Kelly's lockdown - if not for economically ignorant policy.

Being in business is never easy, but Governor Kelly and Joe Biden have turned the American small business landscape into a minefield.

Nonetheless Kelly has anointed herself the David Copperfield of economic development these past months as her election nears, dropping her lingering lockdown job losses through a trap door in the campaign stage while dutiful Boy Wonder-turned- Lieutenant Governor David Toland runs the wind and fog machine behind her. But the sleight-of-hand is lacking; the dynamic duo have tried to take credit for every privately-funded venture from lemonade stands to battery plant expansions in Kansas ever since Republican legislators put an end to Kelly's never-ending, Judd's Farewell Tour-esque phased reopening plan in 2020. The state's business people and investors aren't fooled. Taking credit for someone else's work is never too convincing.

Indeed - no matter how much sweat, toil and 'your-butt's-on-the-line' money you borrowed to start or revive your business the past two years, it was really Kelly/Toland responsible for your success - according to them. In the immortal words of the patron saint of Democrat cash registers and health insurance Barack Hussein Obama: "you didn't build that."

The rabbit fell through the bottom of Kelly's hat recently at Sporting KC (soccer in Kansas

- it's completely an east-of-Highway 75 kind of thing) when she proclaimed in a TV interview and against all fact-checking reality that "I know that during the pandemic, that every place lost jobs, but we have restored those jobs and more."

Que the rimshot. It's almost like the way she went all Sharks and Jets in taunting the recession several weeks ago, proclaiming "bring it on" to the economic slowdown we're now in, because she had enough of your tax money in her strong box to pay for state government even if you lost your job.

The fly in Kelly's butter of course is that according to the latest estimates as of June, Kansas has recovered not quite 80 percent of the 157,000 some-odd jobs the governor sacrificed during the pandemic in order to keep her standing among the nation's Democrat-led state shutdown champions. According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics (where a bunch of people work who know how to count) Kansas ranks 44th out of 50 states in U.S. pandemic jobs recovery. "Inflation Reduction Act" doesn't reduce inflation

Senate Democrats' latest party-line attempt to push their social agenda through Congress lifts Orwellian naming conventions to new heights. The Inflation Reduction Act of 2022? They might as well add "World Peace" and "Global Democracy," since the bill has roughly the same odds of achieving those ends.

There's a net \$300 billion in the bill dedicated to reducing the deficit through higher taxes. In normal times, when inflation runs around 2%, a tax increase of about 1.2% of gross domestic product would exert some downward pressure on inflation. But because the deficit reduction is concentrated at the end of a 10-year period, only about a tenth of this reduction, 0.12% of GDP, would materialize in the next year.

For context, in March 2021 Democrats shoveled \$1.9 trillion, or 8.6% of GDP, in new fiscal spending into the economy through the similarly ill-named American Rescue Plan. This fiscal injection came as the economy was already reopening on its own thanks to vaccines, precisely when it was counterproductive and sowed the seeds of inflation. The Federal Reserve also kept interest rates at zero until March 2022, the same as they were in March 2020, when there was a double-digit hole in the economy because of Covid lockdowns.

This ludicrous policy mix has driven inflation to 9.1%, a four-decade high. Inflation has outstripped wage growth, causing households

to see real wages fall by 5.6% since the end of 2020. Now, to address earlier mistakes, Senate Democrats propose reducing the deficit by a little over 1% of GDP over 10 years. Through this lens, the Inflation Reduction Act's disinflationary contribution is a tiny fraction of the American Rescue Plan's inflationary contribution. Senate Democrats took a flame-thrower to a forest and now want to put out the fire with a squirt gun.

The details of the bill are even worse. The deficit reduction comes not from spending cuts, which would reduce demand, but tax hikes, which reduce supply. The inflation hitting American families is a result of demand outstripping supply. The Inflation Reduction Act will place further constraints on supply

through regulations and tax increases, as well as redirecting resources via hundreds of billions of dollars of special-interest subsidies aimed at Democrat constituencies. Roughly half of all new taxes would be paid by manufacturers, a disincentive for production. The bill would unleash an army of tax enforcers on small businesses, raising their costs and impeding their ability to respond to customers.

All this combines to exacerbate the demand-supply imbalance. And while the deficit reduction is concentrated at the end of the 10-year window, the supply-distorting subsidies are granted upfront.

Instead, there are two approaches Congress and the administration should take to address inflation. First, stay out of the Fed's way and let it use its tools to address the supply-demand imbalance. Thus far, the Fed has had the necessary freedom of action. But the picture might change as the economy slows. Sen. Elizabeth Warren's recent criticism of rate increases may be a harbinger.

Second, make it easier for the supply side to adjust to changes in demand. Before Covid, the U.S. could sustain unemployment below 4% without inflation because tax and regulatory reform allowed the supply side to expand to meet rising demand.

What other actions can government take?

Garland sacrifices DOJ in pursuit of Trump

Does Attorney General Merrick Garland know that he is investigating the man most likely to be the opponent of the president he serves? Does he realize that the intense political pressure campaign that he's under to indict that man has been plainly visible to everyone? Does he care?

If we can't know where Garland is ultimately heading in his probe of Jan. 6 and the documents seized from Mar-a-Lago, all indications are that he is preparing the ground for an indictment of Donald J. Trump.

The former president is inflammatory and mendacious as a matter of course, but in this case, it is the mild-mannered former judge who came within a hair's breadth of a lifetime appointment to the Supreme Court who is rehearsing for the role of arsonist.

An indictment of Trump would be one of the most consequential acts by the Justice Department in decades, and Garland has a flagrant conflict of interest and is likely to have to use an adventurous legal theory to try to nail Trump - at the same time, the legitimacy of his institution is increasingly in doubt.

This is not a promising formula. An attorney general shouldn't consider the prospect of reaping the whirlwind and think, "Bring it on."

The Jan. 6 committee, elected Democrats, and the media have been braying for Garland to move against Trump. President Biden himself has reportedly told aides in private that Garland should indict Trump. "Garland Faces Growing Pressure as Jan. 6 Investigation Widens," The New York Times reported earli-

er this year. It would take truly cursed independence and enormous moral and political courage not to take the path of least resistance and give in to these voices. Garland appears to be bending, presumably on his way to breaking.

It is amazing that he's gotten this far without feeling a prick of conscience about his own status. I have no use for special counsels as a general matter, but how can an attorney general make highly sensitive determinations that will quite probably affect the state of play of the next presidential election without realizing he has a profound conflict of interest?

It'd be one thing if Trump had shot someone on Fifth Avenue - a clean, no-doubt crime that wouldn't require any novel theories or difficult-to-probe contentions about his state of mind to prosecute.

In contrast, Trump's Jan. 6 offenses involve alleged crimes, like obstructing Congress or

defrauding the U.S., that are going to involve tricky questions about his motives and where the legitimate exercise of his powers ends and the supposed criminality begins.

Needless to say, the country is not prepared to adjudicate such questions in a calm, high-minded manner. It will be the O.J. Simpson trial meets the Hiss-Chambers case, with a presidential race not in the background, but very much in the foreground.

The fact of the matter is that while Trump's moral blameworthiness for Jan. 6 is not in doubt, his legal culpability is. It's easy to write an op-ed or say on cable TV that Trump incited an insurrection. As a legal matter, though, Trump didn't come close to crossing the line to incitement, which has very specific and high standards under law.

Even his infamous Georgia phone call looks different on the close reading it would get as part of any court case - by the end of the call, his lawyers were only asking that the secretary of state's office tell them why their court of suspected fraudulent votes was off.

In an environment of ever-spiraling political conflict, it's difficult for anyone to exercise forbearance - to realize the most emotionally satisfying course isn't necessarily the correct one and to be constrained by the public interest, even if that enrages his or her own side.

Merrick Garland can still err on the side of statesmanship. He looks set, though, to choose the abyss.

The top right picture is of a brass button, which remains unidentified. It appears to be a military button of some type. It has the wire soldered shank on the reverse side.

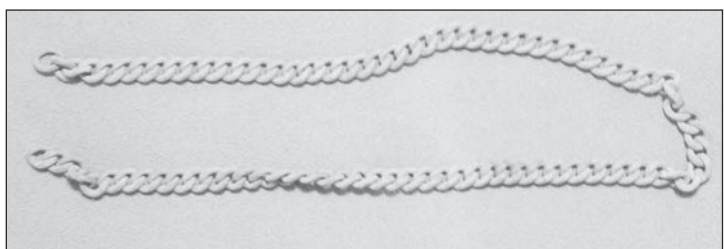
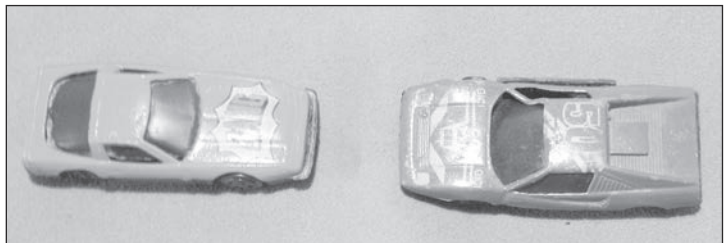
The middle right picture is of a pair of cars found at a site. It seems some children found what is left of the sand pile from when the old stone house was re-chinked in 1917.

Reduce red tape, which is a barrier to entry and prevents competition; eliminate restrictions on construction, so housing and commercial buildings can quickly go up where economically efficient; remove requirements for occupational licensing, so workers can quickly learn on the job and change

their roles to respond to labor shortages; and acknowledge that fossil fuels won't be regulated out of existence in five years' time, so that the energy industry believes there's a future, and can justify investing today.

To address inflation, we first have to identify its roots in a demand-supply imbalance. The Inflation Reduction Act will not only fail to address this imbalance, it will exacerbate it.

At best there will be an insignificant effect on inflation. At worst it will push inflation higher and further erode American families' spending power.

lots of jobs to help out," said Cumplido. "The hard work and importance of family I developed from my hometown has definitely carried over to my Navy career."

The Navy's presence aboard an Air Force base in the middle of America may seem like an odd location given its distance from any ocean; however, the central location allows for the deployment of aircraft to both coasts and the Gulf of Mexico on a moment's notice. This quick response is key to the success of the nuclear deterrence mission.

The Navy command consists of a Wing staff, the Center for Naval Aviation Technical Training, and three Fleet Air Reconnaissance Squadrons: The "Ironmen" of VQ 3, the "Shadows" of VQ 4 and the "Roughnecks" of VQ 7.

Cumplido serves as an aviation structural mechanic with VQ 4.

"My favorite thing about my job is getting to help my junior sailors," said Cumplido.

STRATCOMMWING One employs more than 1,300 active-duty sailors and 100 contractors to provide maintenance, security, operations, administration, training and logistic support for the Boeing E-6 Mercury aircraft fleet, an

airborne command post and communications relay based on the Boeing 707.

Their mission stems from the original 1961 Cold War order known as "Take Charge and Move Out!" Adapted as TACAMO and now the command's nickname, the men and women of TACAMO continue to provide a survivable communication link between national decision makers and the nation's nuclear weapons.

The commander-in-chief issues orders to members of the military who operate nuclear weapons aboard submarines, aircraft or in land-based missile silos. Sailors aboard TACAMO E-6 Mercury aircraft provide the one-of-a-kind and most-survivable communication needed for this critical mission.

With more than 90 percent of all trade traveling by sea, and 95 percent of the world's international phone and internet traffic carried through fiber optic cables lying on the ocean floor, Navy officials continue to emphasize that the prosperity and security of the United States is directly linked to a strong and ready Navy.

Serving in the Navy means Cumplido is part of a team that is taking on new importance in America's focus on rebuilding military readiness, strengthening alliances and reforming

business practices in support of the National Defense Strategy.

"The Navy contributes to the National Defense Strategy by providing forward deterrence and forward defense," said Cumplido. "We're the first line of defense protecting our coasts."

Cumplido and the sailors they serve with have many opportunities to achieve accomplishments during their military service.

"My proudest accomplishment in the Navy was advancing in rank to petty officer first class," said Cumplido. "I beat the average in how fast people generally advance in my career field. I'm also proud of the travel the Navy has provided me. There's no job I could have that would allow me to travel to the places I've been. I'm very grateful for those opportunities."

As Cumplido and other sailors continue to perform missions, they take pride in serving their country in the United States Navy.

"To me, serving in the Navy means financial stability," added Cumplido. "I'll retire at 39 years old and then be able to do whatever I want, whenever I want. That's pretty awesome."

Traffic Safety Alert: School has started, drive carefully

Now that school is under way across the state of Kansas, AAA Kansas warns drivers to be extra vigilant, especially during the before- and after-school hours.

This time of year is particularly dangerous due to the combination of young inexperienced drivers, school buses, and student pedestrians and bicyclists, all sharing the road. Through its annual 'School's Open - Drive Carefully' public awareness campaign, AAA aims to help reduce fatalities and injuries among child pedestrians and others during busy school commutes.

"It's that time when drivers need to avoid distractions, and be much more aware and careful, as students head back to schools," said Shawn Steward, AAA Kansas spokesman. "Kids will be walking and biking to school, getting on and off school buses and in and out of cars as parents drop them off and pick them up. All of these situations create extra hazards for drivers as well as the student pedestrians and bicyclists. In addition, many new, inexperienced teen drivers will

be driving to school for the first time, creating additional concerns for traffic safety."

Nearly one-fifth of traffic fatalities of children below the age of 15 are pedestrians, with more school-age pedestrians killed between the hours of 3 p.m. and 4 p.m. than any other time of day.

To keep school kids safe, AAA Kansas recommends these seven safety tips:

- Slow down. Speed limits in school zones are reduced for a reason. According to the AAA Foundation for Traffic Safety, a pedestrian struck by a vehicle traveling at 25 m.p.h. is nearly two-thirds less likely to be killed compared to a pedestrian struck by a vehicle traveling just 10 m.p.h. faster.
- Ditch the distractions. Children often cross the road unexpectedly and may emerge suddenly between two parked cars. Research shows that taking your eyes off the road for just two seconds doubles your chances of crashing. Put down the phone and focus on driving safely.
- Brake for buses. It may be tempting to drive around

a stopped school bus, but not only is it dangerous, it's against the law, no matter from which direction you're approaching the stopped bus.

- Reverse responsibly. Every vehicle has blind spots. Check for children on the sidewalk, driveway and around your vehicle before slowly backing up. Teach your children to never play in, under or around vehicles—even those that are parked.
- Talk with your teen. Car crashes are one of the leading causes of death for teens in the United States, and more than one in four fatal crashes involving teen drivers occur during the after-school hours of 3 p.m. to 7 p.m. Learn more at <https://cluballiance.aaa.com/traffic-safety/teen-driving>

•Come to a complete stop. Research shows that more than one-third of drivers roll through stop signs in school zones or neighborhoods. Always come to a complete stop, checking carefully for children on sidewalks and in crosswalks before proceeding.

- Be aware of bicycles. Children on bikes are often inexperienced, unsteady and unpredictable. Slow down and allow at least three feet of passing distance between your vehicle and the bicycle. If your child rides a bicycle to school, require that they wear a properly-fitted bicycle helmet on every ride.

Bus Rides and Harvest

As I was outside with my kids waiting for them to catch their big yellow bus to begin another school year, I was reminded of how all of the back-to-school excitement is similar to the anticipation of fall on the farm.

Being that it's a new school year, the kids are understandably excited to return to school. This has translated to them getting out to their bus stop with plenty of time to spare ensuring they don't miss the bus and avoiding frantic, last-minute morning chaos.

As we get closer to the start of fall harvest, we are also getting out into the fields and testing the moisture of the corn with plenty of time to spare. While some might argue it's still too early, just like with the kids, we want to make sure we experience a smooth transition into fall harvest with as little unnecessary chaos as possible.

In the days leading up to the first day of classes, our school district provided us with a rough estimate of when we should expect the bus to arrive. Although we had a good idea of when to expect the bus, we knew to be ready a little before the expected time while also understanding if it was later.

Just like the morning bus,

we know fall harvest will get here. We're not quite sure when exactly that will be; we just have to be ready to go when it's time.

While waiting for their bus, I reminded my two children to be observant as they have the tools needed to identify the bus and know when it's coming minutes before actually seeing it. If one listens, amid the morning sounds of feed trucks and cattle in the distance, the distinct sound of the bus bouncing down the gravel roads can be heard.

As adults, we too have tools to use to help determine when it's time to harvest. While it might not be our sense of hearing, we do scout fields using our eyes to make observations while also picking and shelling ears of corn before testing for moisture. If we look, the distinct signs of a field that's ready for harvest can be seen.

Once on the morning bus, I watched the silhouettes of my two little ones cautiously walking down the aisle before committing and settling into their seats for the duration of their morning ride. I know both my son and daughter prefer to sit up near the front of the bus to avoid negative results like getting car sick or getting themselves into trouble.

We will also be intentional

in our field selections prior to committing the machines to a field as we want to make sure our decisions will not cause negative results like dockage once our grain is delivered to the elevator.

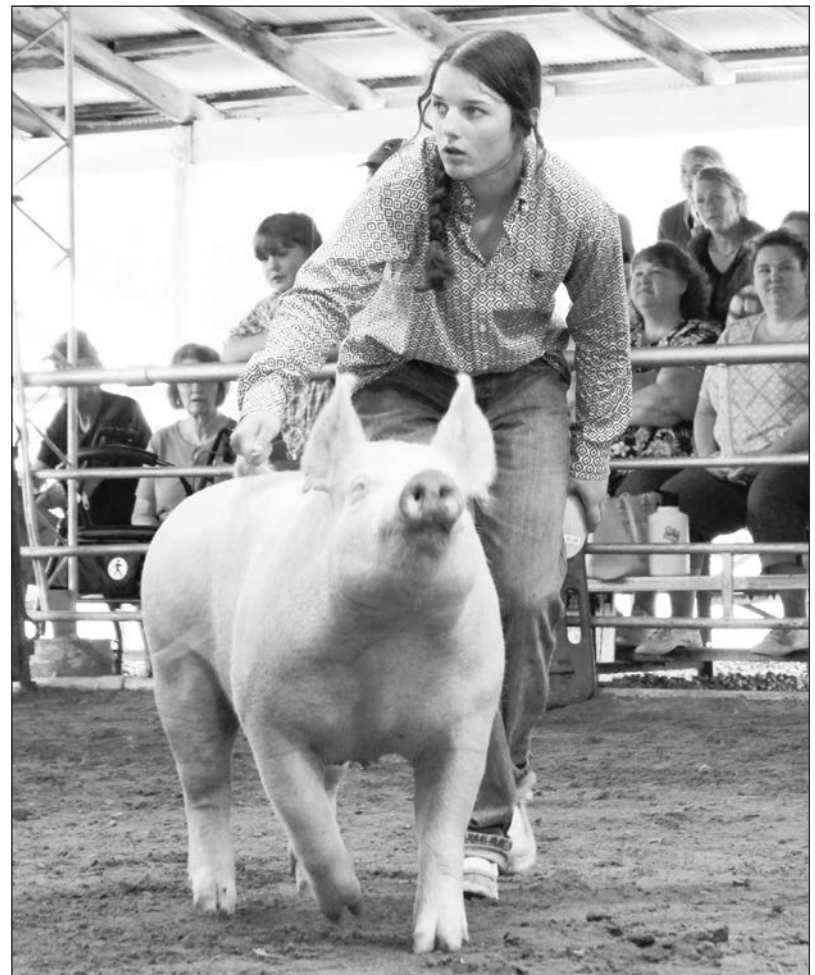

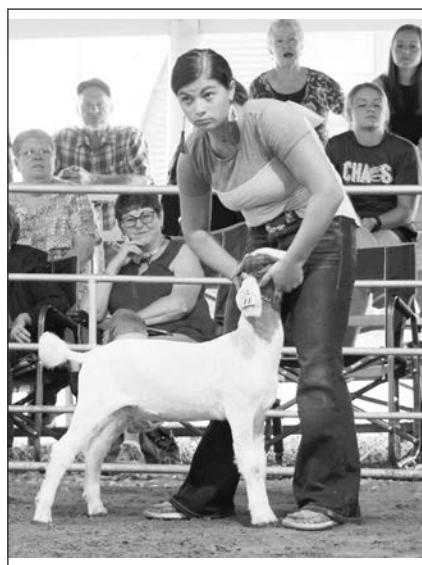

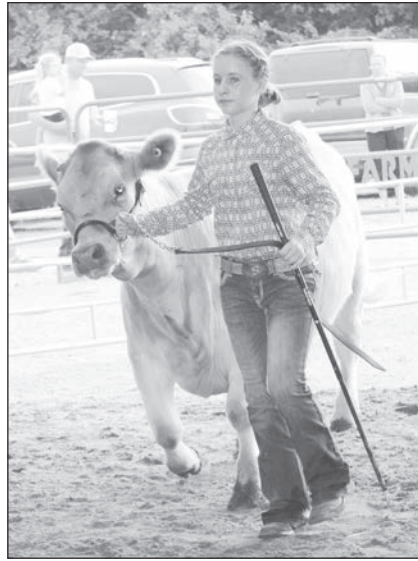
