## Covid gut punch continues for local restaurants

**Staffing, other operating issues continue to hamper restaurants across industry**

GARNETT - Two Garnett restaurants shut down last week, one temporarily while it arranged a reduced hours schedule and one apparently permanently, amid a continuing tough post-Covid environment for eateries.

Trade Winds Bar & Grill closed temporarily August 9 and over the weekend announced it will open Tuesdays-Saturdays beginning today from 3 p.m.-11 p.m., according to the restaurant's Facebook page. The temporary closing came after owner Angi Smith was directed by her doctor to get some rest to help get over a nagging medical condition. A follow up FB post stipulated management expected the shutdown would be temporary and was not a permanent closing.

Troyer's 1883 in downtown Garnett announced it would close permanently, after reducing its hours and days of operation in recent weeks. After purchasing and partially renovating the former Maloan's Restaurant in a historic building in downtown Garnett, Troyer's owner Jessica Troyer said after struggling with the restaurant and coffee shop since opening last August she planned to return to her former position as a project manager for J.E. Dunn Construction.

A previous Facebook post said Troyer's planned to continue its catering service and facility rental endeavors, but its website and

Facebook page were no longer available late last week. Troyer did not return calls from the Review for this story.

Both owners commented over the past year regarding trouble with staffing their operations in the ongoing tight local labor market, which was also a factor in the closing of a restaurant at Colony a year ago. Trade Winds reduced its hours and



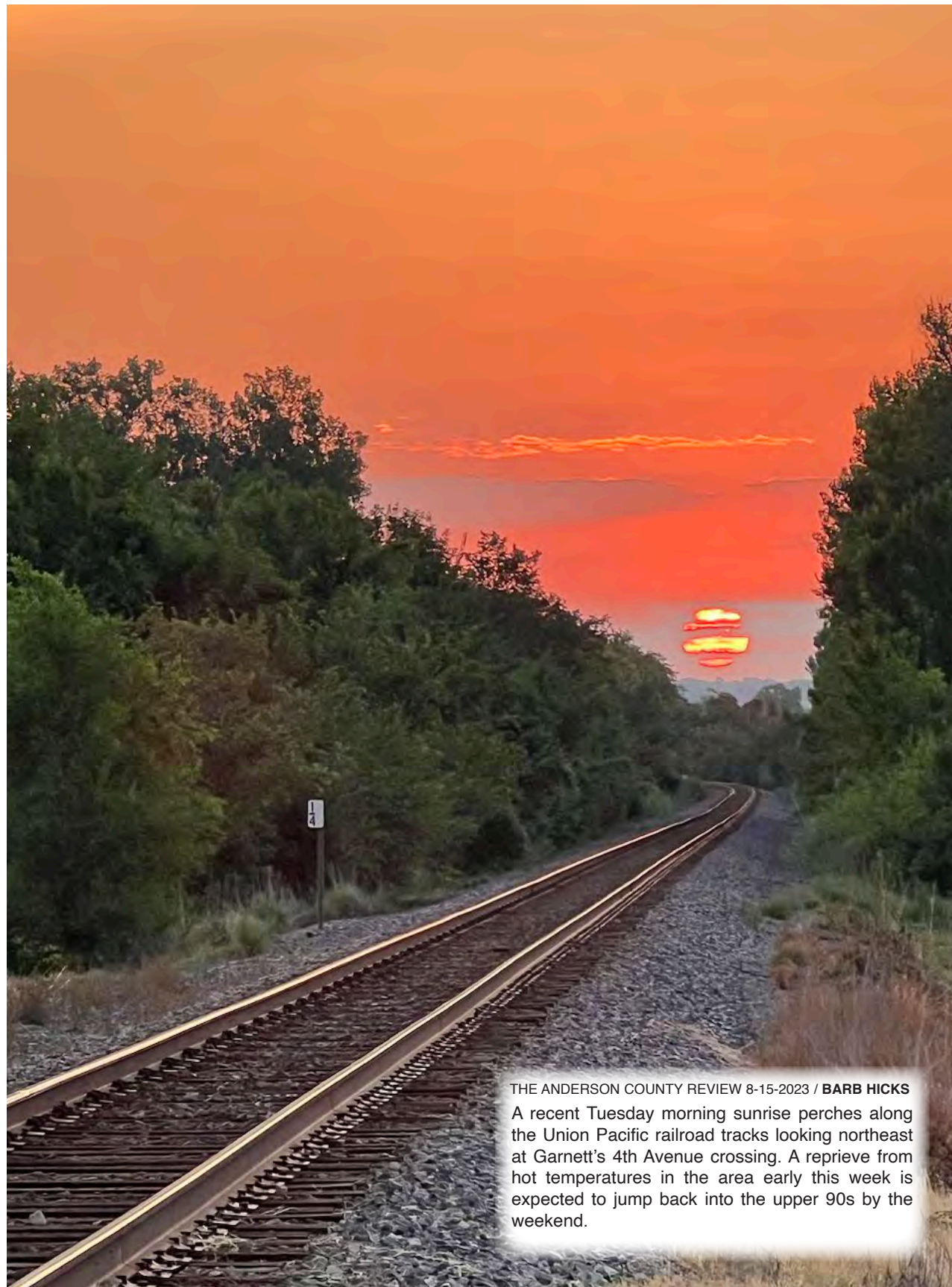

closed at least twice temporarily over the past year as well.

Restaurants aren't the only operations facing problems with staffing amid the 3 percent unemployment environment in Anderson County and much of Kansas. The City of Garnett has sought to fill multiple openings over the past year as have other private employers, echoing continuing problems in attracting

## Woman injured when truck strikes the horse she was riding

BUSH CITY - A local woman was injured Wednesday when the horse she was riding in eastern Anderson County apparently bolted into the path of an oncoming vehicle.

Anderson County Undersheriff Wes McClain said Candy Kent, 40 of rural Garnett, was riding horseback along the right-of-way of Texas Road north of 1300 Road when her horse apparently darted up the embankment and into the path of a truck driven by Jason

Hermreck of Bush City.

The horse died from its injuries and Kent was transported to Anderson County Hospital for treatment of injuries including a head injury. Neither Hermreck nor his passenger, Alyssa Staats of Paola, were injured.

A source close to Kent said she was treated at St. Luke's Hospital on the Plaza for a broken collarbone and other injuries as well as a slight brain bleed from the incident. She was expected to be released late last week.

## USD 365 budget for next year proposed at \$23.8 million

GARNETT - USD 365 in Garnett will exceed its "revenue neutral" budget guideline for next school year according to its draft budget released last week, which will authorize potential expenses of up to \$23.8 million with some \$5.3 million in locally-generated tax funding.

Overall, the budget calls from a district-wide property tax increase of more than \$502,000 compared to the present budget year.

The district's public budget hearing is set for 7:30 p.m. Thursday, Sept. 7, at the district boardroom at 305 N. Oak in Garnett.

The spending plan reflects a total of \$3.8 million in addi-

tional expenses over the 2022-2023 school year with about \$3.6 million estimated in transfers from this year's budget. A detailed summary of the budget can be found in last week's Review.

The "revenue neutral" law passed by the Kansas Legislature requires special notification to the public whenever public entities increase the amount of tax dollars to be spent over what they spent the previous year. The move was intended as an incentive to local elected boards to lower mill levies and restrain spending when local property appraisals

## Kansas newspaper owner dead after police raid

**Questions about after LEOs raid Kansas paper, ignite press issue**

MARION - The seizure of computers and equipment from a Kansas newspaper on Friday for as yet unknown reasons which apparently brought about the death of one of its owners over the weekend has thrust the town of Marion into the national media spotlight, and focused national discussion on the issue of governmental abuse of a free press and the First Amendment.

Joan Meyer, 98 years old and the wife of Kansas Newspaper Hall of Fame member the late Bill Meyer, died Saturday after Marion County sheriff's deputies and city police raided her home and the newspaper's downtown offices the day prior in the course what a search warrant termed an identity theft investigation. The newspaper and publishing company was operated by its majority owner Eric Meyer, Joan Meyer's 69 year-old son.

Eric Meyer blamed his mother's death on the stress of the search of her home.

Marion officials however are reported to have maintained that no probable cause affidavit exists upon which the warrant was issued and signed by Marion County Magistrate Judge Laura Viar. Viar has said her office does not have the affidavit. Police also seized

the cellphone of a Record reporter during the search.

The incident in question surrounded local restaurant owner Kari Newell's drunk driving arrest more than a decade ago and her effort recently to seek a liquor license for her catering service - information which was provided to the newspaper and confirmed but which the paper did not use in a story. Since no probable cause affidavit has been produced, the background for an allegation of identity theft is unknown at this time.

Newell and Eric Meyer had history, according to published reports. Meyer told CNN he and a reporter were asked to leave

Newell's business in recent weeks during a meet-and-greet with 2nd District Congressman Jake LaTurner and his staff. Newell told CNN "When they came into the establishment, I quietly and politely asked them to exit. I didn't feel that their constituents needed to be exposed to any risk of being misquoted."

A staffer who spoke with the Review Saturday said the newspaper would be unable to produce its paper by its Tuesday press deadline since its equipment was being held as evidence by law enforcement. Officials with the Kansas Press Association said Saturday Eric Meyer had procured other

equipment and was in the process of producing his next edition for Wednesday. Stories at [www.marionrecord.com](http://www.marionrecord.com) have chronicled the incident thus far.

A statement from the Kansas Bureau of Investigation said law officers in Marion requested KBI assistance in investigating illegal access and dissemination of confidential criminal justice information and that KBI had assigned an agent to the case last Tuesday. The statement said though KBI has requested and executed local warrants in the past, it did neither in the Marion case.

# Wanted: A damn good reason

All hell broke loose out at the Marion County Record newspaper office in Marion last week. Now a woman is dead, and questions scream for answers.

A judge there and the chief of police have a lot of explaining to do. If you're going to shut down a newspaper and confiscate its records and cause a woman's death in the process, you'd better have a damn good reason.

It's not the kind of story we typically see a lot of in Kansas or thankfully anywhere else in the U.S. for that matter. Despite the polarization in American culture right now and the outright hatred some have for the media, most Americans have enough understanding of our values to recognize you don't just destroy a newspaper. When pro-slave terrorists sacked Lawrence in the lead up to the Civil War, newspapers were their first targets. Newspapers - journalists in general - who do their jobs make enemies. Love us or hate us, that's the way it's supposed to be.

In the handful of days since Friday's police raid on the Marion County Record there have been a lot of comparisons to authoritarian attacks on press freedom, but the fact is that right now the rest of the world just doesn't know what's going on there. It's a typical local mess with personalities and politics and somebody - we'll eventually find out who - crossed the line.

A handful of facts are clear: Marion police and county sheriff's deputies simultaneously raided the home of the publishers and the newspaper office of the little weekly newspaper on Friday. The stress likely caused 98 year-old Joan Meyer, wife of the late publisher Bill Meyer and mother of present editor and publisher Eric Meyer, to collapse and pass away Saturday after the raid.

The search warrant points toward allegations of identity theft - that the paper somehow accessed private records of a local woman with whom the paper had been feuding - a woman who had a previous DUI arrest and who was trying to get a liquor license in town. Eric Meyer says a source provided information about Kari Newell's DUI to the paper, and the Record confirmed it with a public records search, then never used the info in a story anyway. He did publish a story about Newell throwing him and a reporter out of a meeting at her restaurant where Congressman Jake LaTurner was speaking weeks prior. Whether Meyer has evidence on his computer implicating him in a crime presumably will be confirmed or dispelled once the cops are done pilfering through the Record's data. No doubt the legal ramifications, if not in

criminal charges then in the newspaper's civil suit against the agencies, will stretch out a long time.

But just as interesting is reporting from MSNBC contributor Marisa Kabas published in her Substack blog, who says Eric Meyer told her the computers also include names of former co-workers of Marion Police Chief Gideon Cody, hired by the city a few months ago, who told the newspaper Cody left his previous job over allegations of sexual misconduct, but got hired in Marion anyway. For his part, Cody claims on the PD's Facebook page local law enforcement will be vindicated of effectively derailing the paper when the smoke clears.

Another wrinkle is in the documentation for the search warrant itself. Eighth District Magistrate Judge Laura Viar signed the search warrant, but there seems to be no laying hands on the probable cause affidavit completed by the investigating agency which gives the evidence to justify violating the newspaper and its publishers' rights by conducting a forcible search. The Review and numerous others have requested that document, but it can take up to 10 days to be turned over, presuming it exists.

For his part, Eric Meyer apparently somehow managed to cobble enough equipment together to get his paper out this week. In whatever state it is, considering all his newsgathering and production necessities were missing, worldwide media attention and while mourning the loss of his mother and partner, the fact he published at all is a Herculean accomplishment that should illustrate his commitment to the community and his mission.

Sometimes it's easy to point out the pitfalls

While most celebrities try to convince themselves and the watching world that the path to success is paved with abortion, it's always refreshing to hear the true message that embracing what our bodies were designed to do brings the utmost fulfillment.

Women have a totally unique and kick-butt ability to incubate a human life from the

moment of conception and then labor through the intense task of bringing that whole new person into the outside world. Ladies literally create families and communities and nations - all with the insane power that is our bodies. Oh, you made partner? That's nice. She made people!

How the heck did multiple generations get duped into thinking our uterus gave us the raw end of the deal? That's what happens when you convince yourself and the rest of your sex that C-section scars are less admirable than C-suits and that managing a household is lame compared to managing a marketing department.

Radical feminists don't just lie about what

babies do to careers, though. They resent what babies do to bodies: Goodbye, hourglass. Hello, saggy, puffy, human burp cloth. Ever notice how "body positivity" feminists love obesity but loathe the idea of a little baby weight?

In an attempt to have babies but avoid the dreaded body changes, some celebrities turn to the exploitative surrogacy industry. Just ask Khloe Kardashian how that goes. # Trump's Republican primary contenders are afraid

Donald Trump has gotten indicted yet again, and, as usual, most of the other Republican candidates have been sympathetic, if not outright deferential, to him.

It's another episode that raises the question: Can someone who is afraid of Trump defeat him?

Of all the advantages that Trump has in the competition for the 2024 Republican nomination - immediate past president, ability to generate enormous media attention, etc. - perhaps foremost among them is the fact that the other Republican candidates are afraid.

It's hard to think of anyone who has ever won a major-party nomination while showing fear, especially of someone else in the field.

A successful candidate might be careful around certain issues or constituencies, or back off of an unpopular position. But being clearly scared by an opponent is something else, entirely. George W. Bush and John McCain might have hated or disdained each other in 2000, same with McCain and Mitt Romney in 2008, or Romney and Newt Gingrich in 2012. But no one was ever clearly, demonstrably afraid.

Until now.

When asked about Trump, most of the candidates might not actually lick their lips, or swallow hard or begin to blink faster, but you wouldn't be surprised if they did. Generally, they'll evade questions, reject the premise or revert to an answer that has been as carefully crafted as an official statement by one of the parties negotiating the Paris Peace Accords.

You can almost see them thinking:

Maybe he'll leave me alone.

Maybe he'll make me his veep.

Maybe there will be a better time to attack

him later.

If they can help it, his opponents will never say Trump's name - he's the most unnamed major politician in American history. Mike Pence has tended to call him "my former running mate."

This means that Donald Trump's political dominance of the rest of the field extends to a kind of personal and psychological dominance.

A key aspect of the Trump phenomenon from the beginning has been how he's brought the subrational element of politics that's always been there, but usually relatively submerged, to the fore - more Frans de Waal, author of "Chimpanzee Politics," than Richard Hofstadter; more Dana White than Lee Atwater.

This raises the possibility that not taking Trump head-on means more than simply missing the opportunity to make the case against him. It also means implicitly acknowledging

his status as the Big Man of Republican politics, and the rival's status as a subordinate player in the world Trump created and rules.

The only one who's really not playing this game is Chris Christie, who gives as good as he gets and also needles Trump and initiates fights against him. If Christie can achieve a breakout in New Hampshire, it will be based, in part, on winning points on strength and courage while doing and saying what no one else dares. (Also-rans Will Hurd and Asa Hutchinson criticize Trump, too, but more politely and conventionally.)

All that said, the other candidates are reacting to a genuine conundrum - Republican voters might be open to an alternative to Trump in theory, but they don't want anyone to criticize him. How to square that circle is the biggest challenge for the rest of the field, at least those members of it genuinely running to win.

To be fair, Governor Ron DeSantis, as Trump's main target, has been willing to push back as necessary, and he makes a constant, implicit critique of Trump's electoral prospects and governing abilities. But the Florida governor is always careful to stay on the right side of the line, biding his time for later or hoping that his message catches on without having to grasp the nettle. This isn't unreasonable, but, again, it exposes a disparity - he has a strategy, while Trump has a sledgehammer.

So long as everyone believes that Trump has one and they don't - and acts accordingly - the fear factor will continue to work in Trump's favor.

"We have investigated those who work at schools, churches and at all levels of public service. No one is above the law, whether a public official or a representative of the media," the statement said.

## 50 years ago...Locals complain about theft of fresh grown food

### 60 years ago...

Cities Service Gas Company is planning to construct approximately ten miles of thirty-inch pipeline between the company's Welda and Ottawa, Kansas, compressor stations to meet the 1963-1964 peak day delivery requirement of customers in the greater Kansas City area. Twenty-nine representatives from the Garnett High School Future Farmers of America visited the Farmers Chemical Company in Joplin, MO. Earl Whitely Motors, Inc has purchased the Dail Smith residential property at the corner of Second and Maple for the purpose of location a display lot for new and used cars along Highway 59. City clerks at Garnett and Greeley have prepared their budgets for the coming fiscal year and have been published. Garnett's tangible valuation this year is \$2,968,530, an increase over 1962 when figures were quoted at nearly \$60,000 less. This affected the slight lowering of the tax levy required to finance expenditures for the coming year in estimated excess of \$775,000. The levy to raise this amount is 13.55 mills, which is .25 of a mill less than the 13.8 mills needed for the current year's expenses. Residents in Greeley will be glad to learn that there will be a sizable reduction in their city tax levy for the coming year. Late Saturday night proved to be another perfect night for the Go-Kart drivers, as well as spectators. Seventeen karts with drivers from Garnett and other towns in the area provided the large crowd with ample entertainment under the guiding hand of Dr. Paul Nesbitt.

### 50 years ago...

Anderson County's regional welfare office will be located in Osawatomete starting January 1 if the tentative sites of the 36 regional offices in the state are approved as permanent sites. The Osawatomete office would service Miami, Linn, and Anderson counties. Family Life workers will soon be in the area for the Catholic Church. The new activity is being done by seven Catholic parishes as staff of the churches. David and Diane Hentges moved to Garnett and are working with the local parishes of Garnett, Westphalia, Burlington, Osage City, Scranton, Baldwin, and Ottawa. The Family Life workers will work with families to relay communication between families and the church in an attempt to identify if there is need for new programs, as well as the implementation of the programs. The Western Auto Associate Store in Garnett is making plans to move in addition to the expansion of product lines, and the opening of the new store in Garnett. The new location will be at the business formerly occupied by the Baldrige Pontiac Agency, just north of Pizza Hut. Anderson County Extension Agent Maxury Harrington says that the 1983 corn crop is a replay of 1980, when the majority of the crop burning in the drought. Harrington estimates that 90% of the corn crop has been lost, and only some irrigated corn in the county and some corn planted early survives. Two Garnett brothers will soon undertake an invasive surgery and the gift of life in Dallas. Dale Feuerborn will have surgery to remove one of his kidneys for transplantation into his brother Jim. Jim, the elder brother, suffers from diabetes milletus. The disease has already caused blindness and later the removal of both eyes two years ago, however, Jim has continued his job as a mechanical engineer through the use of transcribed information until March of this year. Dale was tested for many months before agreeing to the donor specific transplant and improving his brother's chances of survival from 25% to 95%.

### 30 years ago...

A cooperative effort between the Kansas Corn Growers Association, the Kansas Grain Sorghum Producers and Beckman Motors of Garnett has resulted in three new ethanol-powered Chevrolet Lumina's being added to the rental fleet at the local dealership. The cars are powered by a mixture of 85 percent ethanol and 15 percent standard unleaded gasoline and are part of the Kansas Biofuels Project. Members of the Anderson County Economic Development committee and a Chanute-based assisted living housing company will sponsor a public meeting this coming Sunday to explain the current interest in building a facility in Anderson County. A Burlington sky-diver performing with the Garnett based demonstration team was critically injured last Friday during a jump at the Coffey County Fair. Randy Holtz was injured when the parachute he was piloting apparently went into a series of unexplained, high velocity, low altitude turns at it neared the landing point and collided with the ground. The experi-

enced sky-diver suffered multiple fractures of the foot, upper and lower leg, hip, arm, and skull. Anderson County Sheriff's Department officers confiscated 42 marijuana plants Wednesday afternoon west of Garnett in the first substantial find of the 1993 growing season.

### 20 years ago...

Friday's passage by the U.S. Senate of an energy bill that includes a Renewable Fuels Standard ensures the continued support of the proposed Ethanol plant, and likely causes more hesitation in the ownership of the plant itself. Friday also marked the final thirty-day countdown to when the East Kansas Agri Energy LLC will tally the total pledged investor capital and decide if new strategies will be needed to collect the nearly \$16 million needed to move forward with the project. County Attorney Fred Campbell has filed an amended charge against the man officials say stole \$30,000 from a local bank. New evidence suggests that the accused man may have taken funds from the bank on two separate occasions. Anderson County Commissioners are expected to approve a 2004 county budget which will result in an estimated 1.1 mill increase in local property taxes, generating an extra \$125,000 in tax funds for the year. The commissioners said at a department meeting last week that they appreciated the staff's help in controlling spending within their own office budgets for the upcoming year. More than half of the increased tax funds will go to the county road and bridge department whose budget was cut over \$190,000 this year due to a reduction in state funding.

### 10 years ago...

Former students of vocal music from the Garnett area gathered to remember their instructor, Paul Massey. Massey was known for developing Garnett High School into one of the top vocal music programs in the state of Kansas, and his reputation transcended the decades that he taught. Masey died Saturday at Olathe Medical Center. An illegal steroid operation in a Garnett Martial Arts Studio that pitted brother against brother has been resolved in court with both brothers taking plea deals that will likely see them both on probation. A local 88-year-old man, who brandished a weapon during a dispute over a dumped load of wheat is fighting the charges against him. The man was arrested in July after he pulled out a .22 caliber pistol during a dispute between two men in a wheat field, according to the police and court reports. The accused man had hired a custom harvesting company to cut his wheat field, but refused to pay the workers after the wheat was loaded but before it could be delivered to the local elevator. When the truck driver refused to transport the unpaid load, the altercation escalated to the driver dumping the load of wheat on the ground and ended with the farmer producing the weapon.

## New round of funding announced for revitalization of downtown buildings

TOPEKA - Lieutenant Governor and Secretary of Commerce David Toland announced today \$1.5 million will be available for a fourth round of Historic Economic Asset Lifeline (HEAL) grants to revitalize dilapidated and underutilized downtown buildings in small communities across the state. HEAL grants help close financial gaps for communities striving to make their downtown districts more economically vibrant.

Since the HEAL grant program was launched in 2021, more than \$3.5 million has been awarded to fund 63 projects in 48 counties throughout Kansas.

Enhancements have been made for HEAL 4.0 that are designed to set up applicants for even greater success, including a longer application period and a maximum award of \$100,000. Additionally, formal bids will be required this round from licensed contractors at the time of application submission.

"HEAL 4.0 will offer even more support and funding for communities working to bring vacant and underutilized buildings back to productive use," Lieutenant Governor and Secretary of Commerce David Toland said. "We want as many communities as possible across the state to benefit from this successful program that breathes new life into downtown districts."

HEAL grants help bring downtown buildings back into

productive use as spaces for:

- New or expanding businesses
- Housing
- Arts and culture
- Civic engagement
- Childcare
- Entrepreneurship

Submitted projects must show potential to be economic drivers in that community and also demonstrate that the space will be occupied by the end of the project. Proof of 1:1 matching funds from the building owner will be required at the time of application.

Communities that received a HEAL grant in the first round (awarded spring/summer 2022) are now eligible to apply again. Communities that received HEAL grants in either fall 2022 or spring 2023 are not eligible to apply this round.

The application window opens August 14 and closes November 10 with award notifications in mid-December.

A virtual webinar about the specifics of the program is scheduled for 10:00 a.m. Friday, August 18. Registration is required and the Zoom link will be provided after registration. Organizations and building owners interested in applying should register and attend the webinar.

## Reading, writing and road rules

WICHITA, Kan. - As some school districts are already back in session and others will be soon for the 2023-2024 school year, AAA reminds drivers and all road users to get back in the mindset of seeing school kids in our neighborhoods and buses on the roads, with a particular focus on safety. 2019 School's Open, Drive Carefully

Back-to-school transportation affects not only school districts, students and parents, but also other motorists on the roads. This time of year is particularly dangerous due to the combination of young inexperienced drivers, school buses, and student pedestrians and bicyclists, all sharing the road. Plus, school districts resume class on different dates, so motorists encounter different situations as they drive through multiple districts in metro-areas.

"Drivers may be out of practice when it comes to the rules of the road, with school buses hitting the streets and students walking and biking to school," said Shawn Steward, AAA Kansas spokesman. "But our responsibility for keeping students safe hasn't changed."

AAA offers the following tips as the new school year gets under way:

### AAA Drop-Off/Pick-Up Safety Tips

•Follow school drop-off and pick-up procedures, and be mindful that these may have changed.

•Don't double park. It blocks visibility for other children and vehicles.

•Don't load or unload children across the street from the school.

•Have children exit the vehicle on the "curb side" every time (so they aren't opening the car door into an oncoming traffic lane or crossing around the front/back of car to get to curb)

•Slow down, eliminate distractions, and watch for children.

### AAA School Bus Safety Tips

•Always Stop for School Buses - Flashing yellow lights on a school bus indicate it is preparing to stop to load or unload children and motorists should slow down and prepare to stop. Red flashing lights and extended stop arms indicate the bus has stopped and children are getting on and off. Motorists are required to stop their vehicles and wait until the red lights stop flashing, the extended stop sign is withdrawn and the bus begins

moving before they can start driving again. It's the law and can result in a hefty fine if you don't.

•Keep Track of Time - Be aware of the time of day you're on the road and how that coincides with the school day. More school-age pedestrians are killed from 7 to 8 a.m. and from 3 to 4 p.m. than any other hours of the day.

•Slow Down - Whether in a school zone or residential neighborhood, drivers should keep their speed low and be prepared to stop quickly for increased vehicle or pedestrian traffic.

•Come to a complete stop - Always come to a complete stop, checking carefully for children on sidewalks and in crosswalks before proceeding.

•Eliminate distractions - Research shows that taking your eyes off the road for just two seconds doubles your chances of crashing. Children can be quick, crossing the road unexpectedly or emerging suddenly between two parked cars. Reduce risk by not using your cell phone while driving.

•Obey Traffic Signs and Signals - Unfortunately, many motorists violate stop signs in school zones and residential neighborhoods, with many failing to come to a complete stop, rolling through a stop sign or not slowing down at all. Motorists are also running red stoplights, putting pedestrians and other motorists at risk.

### AAA Pedestrian Safety Tips

•Cross only at corners so drivers can see you. Never cross between parked cars or mid-block.

•Use a crosswalk when it's available. Don't assume that because you can see the driver, the driver can see you. Always use caution when crossing. Look all ways before crossing. Look and listen for cars, pedestrians and bicyclists.

•Once you have confirmed traffic has stopped, cross when the light indicates it is safe to cross without further hesitation so you have time to cross safely.

•Use the crosswalk push-button signal when possible, and cross when the signal allows. Watch for cars that are turning left or right when you are crossing.

•Walk on a sidewalk when it is provided. If you must walk in the street, walk facing traffic, on the left side of the road and as far to the left as possible. Make it easy for drivers to see you - dress in light colors, wear reflective material or use

a flashlight.

•Remove headphones and don't use cell phones or electronic devices when crossing the street.

•Watch for white lights on the rear of vehicles, signaling backing up in driveways or parking lots.

•Avoid walking alone. Walk with a friend.

### AAA Bicycle Safety Tips

•Make sure your child has the skills to ride a bike safely, such as riding in a straight line and signaling to vehicles when turning.

•Choose the safest route to bike to school, one with less traffic and slower speeds. Use bike paths if they are available.

•Make sure your cyclists understand traffic safety rules, such as riding in the same direction as traffic and stopping at all stop signs and signals.

•Explain the importance of wearing a bike helmet to your child. They're critical to minimizing injury in case of a crash. According to the Insurance Institute of Highway Safety, wearing a helmet can reduce the odds of head injury by half.

•Ride focused and alert. Never use earbuds or electronics while riding.

"Whether it is in designated school zones or on streets throughout town, everyone needs to remain vigilant - put down the phone, focus only on the road, and pay attention to help students get to and from school safely," said Steward.

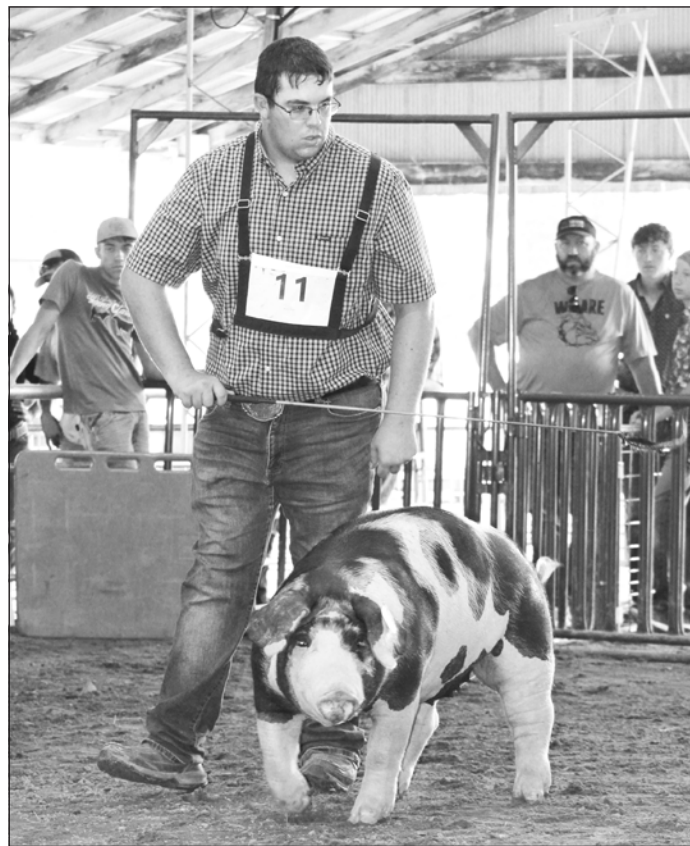
